

For This Cause

t was the last day in the life of Jesus, and He stood before Pontius Pilate. He was asked, "Art thou a king?" Jesus, knowing full well the brutal death that awaited Him, replied, *"For this cause* came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth" (John 18:37). A

few hours later He was crucified, giving His life for the sins of the world. Years later, while imprisoned in Rome, the apostle Paul penned these words: *"For this cause* I Paul, the prisoner of Jesus Christ for you Gentiles" (Ephesians 3:1), and a few verses later he wrote, *"For this cause* I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ," (Ephesians 3:14).

Both Jesus and Paul gave everything, including their lives, for their cause. What was their cause? Paul declared it in Ephesians 6:19-20: "to make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in bonds." Our world is full of causes today. Every day, people are demonstrating in the streets for their cause. They are passionate, they are bold, and they are committed. Should we be any less committed and passionate for our cause? For Jesus and Paul there was but one cause: "to seek and to save that which was lost" (Luke 19:10). To them, all other causes pale in comparison. Should we not feel the same way?

The first century apostolics were swept away in the

cause of Christ. They were busy praying, fasting, studying, witnessing, and making disciples. It consumed them. They did not have time for other causes. Besides, they understood that the new birth (see John 3:5; Acts 2:38) was the solution for all the injustices of the world.

..."to make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in bonds". One does not find the early church demonstrating against the injustices of Caesar and Rome. They were too busy praying and planting churches in Rome, including one in Caesar's household. This is the apostolic way!

Many today are looking for purpose and meaning in life. They are looking

for a cause for which to live and a solution for the social injustices of the world. We have the answer for both! Soon we will expand the ministries and building of Solid Rock Church. We are doing this for the cause of Christ. Why? Because we are caught up in the greatest cause and governmental movement this world has ever known: the kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ!

"Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this" (Isaiah 9:7).

"For whoever is ashamed [here and now] of Me and My words, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when He comes in His glory and the glory of the [heavenly] Father and of the holy angels" (Luke 9:26 Amplified Bible). Here is what by the Grace of God we must do to be an effective witness:

•We must pray that God thrust us out as laborers into the harvest

- •We must pray against intimidation
- •We must pray for protection
- •We must pray for the miraculous
- •We must pray for a demonstration of the Spirit
- •We must pray for our college campuses
