Confidence in Troubled Times

Psalm 46

*Welcome to all Streaming Live; "Virus-Free; Gospel-Rich;" Last Sunday over 725 unique locations...

Over the years you've heard: "We interrupt this Broadcast..." Maybe you've been watching TV or listening to the radio, when the program is interrupted with important news breaking into the world.

*A **NY Times best selling book** ("We interrupt this Broadcast"), **records 46 events in America** so significant they **interrupted the air waves** with **shocking news**.

(Pearl Harbor; Kennedy assass; Elvis dies; and (39 years ago this month) Reagan shot.)

*Most of these "interruptions" have one thing in common: Bad news broke in on good times.

*Beginning today, we are "interrupting our series in Isaiah" to address the urgency of our times.

*If you are brand new with us, we have preached 22 sermons in Isaiah: "God's unfolding Plan"

*But the days unfolding in front of us are so **unsettling**, there is an urgency to interrupt our plans, and offer **relevant words of biblical hope to our community**.

*Monday morning, I woke up around 5am with a Bible verse rolling around in my head.

"We will not fear, though the earth gives way."

*I didn't know where the verse was; I hadn't read it recently; But the Lord kept pestering me.

*Dog owners: Has your dog ever been so hungry that it won't stop begging until you feed him? In the same way, God would not leave me alone until I paid attention.

*I got out of bed, Googled it, and found the reference... Psalm 46.

It's a chapter that begins: **God is our refuge and strength a very present help in trouble**It's a chapter that ends: **"Be still and know that I am God."**

*That day I realized that God was interrupting our series with a critical message for our day.

*More than FOOD/T.P. or anything else, the #1 THING our homes need to STOCK UP on: Confidence.

- Gal 5:10 "I have confidence in the Lord."
- 2 Thess 3:4 "we have **confidence** in the Lord."
- 1 John 3:21 "we have confidence before God."
- Prov 3:26 "the Lord will be your confidence."

*When the world has breaking news, it's usually "BAD news breaking in on good times."

*These Psalms are the opposite; they offer "GOOD news breaking in on bad times."

^{*}And so "we interrupt Isaiah" with Psalms of Confidence.

The Good news of Ps. 46 that breaks into our world: "God is our refuge and strength; a very present help in trouble; and therefore we need not fear **troubled times**: God is with us."

1. God is our refuge, (v.1-3)

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. 2 Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, 3 though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling.

- *This was the verse God woke me up with Monday morning.
- *Over and over, God assures His people in the Psalms: He is a refuge. He is a safe place.
 - *Happen what may, God provides safety; security; stability; & strength.
- *He is not distant, as some suppose Him to be; God is a VERY PRESENT help in trouble!
 - *It means he is close at hand; immediately available; directly at our aid.
 - *With all the talk of social distancing, remember: God is NEVER distant from you.
- *And, the confidence we have: He is our refuge, even if the "worst of the worst" happens.
- *The Psalm gives a series of 4 metaphors that picture the instability of the world. "Thoughs"
 - *Though...Earth 'gives way' Falls apart, like the DOW.
 - *Though...Mountains be moved Things thought stable are dismantled, like economy.
 - *Though...Waters roar Tumultuous times that threaten to sink us.
 - *Though...Mountains tremble Everything we once thought reliable, is shaken.
- *From a worldly perspective this is happening: everything that can be shaken, is being shaken.
- *From a biblical perspective: We have good news: God is a very present help in trouble;
 - *Those who take refuge in Him, need not fear, THOUGH the earth gives way.
 - *We have the confidence of "a kingdom that cannot be shaken" (Heb 12:28)
- *At the beginning of 2020, we said this was a year of getting FOCUSED on things of God.
 - *Who would've thought that it would take such a global shaking to get us focused.

*Get Practical:

- *Dog Ear the corner of Psalm 46. Bookmark it. Read it every morning this week before news.
- *Throughout the day, when we hear more bad news, INTERRUPT the broadcast with:

Fox News: "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help; we will not fear though"

Dow: "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help; we will not fear though"

Virus: "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help; we will not fear though

2. ...even as the world totters - (v.4-7)

4 There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. 5 God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved; God will help her when morning dawns. 6 The nations rage, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts. 7 The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.

*As the world is shaken, it generally causes 2 emotional responses in the world: Anger & Fear

*v.6 says the "nations rage" (ANGER); and the "kingdoms totter" (FEAR)

*Is it not amazing how rapidly the world has tottered?

*When I woke up Monday morning, another word rattled in my mind: "Dismantled"

*I find it remarkable that everything our culture values and trusts is being dismantled.

*Wealth & Savings – dismantled. ("The week that ERASED \$3.6 Trillion..." WSJ)

*Careers & Employment - dismantled.

*Sports – dismantled. (March Madness...has become March Sadness)

*Entertainment & Leisure – dismantled. (Everything we once did for fun.)

*Food & Alcohol – dismantled. (Closing of restaurants and bars)

*Social Connection – dismantled. (The increase of social isolation)

*Vacations & Dreams – dismantled. (The loss of hopes.)

*But with all that's cancelled, I have Good News! The promises of God are NOT CANCELLED.

*Even as the world responds with Anger & Fear, the Psalm offers an alternative way to respond:

*It's the response of joy; hope; and confidence in WHO God is, and WHAT God has promised

- "God is in the midst..."
- o "She shall not be moved..."
- o "God will help her when morning dawns."
- "The Lord of hosts is with us..."
- "God...is our fortress."

*Folks from New Hope may have **concern for the world**, but there is **overwhelming confidence that God is with us...and He is using current events for His glory.**

*I saw one New Hope man downtown TC this week who said:

"This is going to be a catalyst for people to reassess and reprioritize what matters."

*Do you have FAITH IN TROUBLED TIMES? Is your joy secure?

*This is how my wife is reacting to the world. She is so excited about what God is doing...

^{*}That is CONFIDENCE in troubled times! Here is what I'm discovering talking to New Hope people.

- *One of my kids said to her this week: "How can you be so calm?"
- *The reason believers can be confident & full of joy in troubled times:
 - *God's promises do NOT fluctuate with the DOW.
 - *He is **in our midst**; He will **help us**; He is **with us**; He is **our fortress**.
 - *And because of that another Psalm says: "I shall not be shaken." (Ps. 62)

*Most of you know the children's nursery rhyme: "Humpty Dumpty"

"Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall; Humpty Dumpty had a great fall; all the king's horses and all the kings men, couldn't put Humpty together again."

*Christian author Ellis Potter notes that for the Christian, one important line is missing:

"...couldn't put Humpty together again...BUT THE KING COULD!" AND THE KING DID.

*With all the tottering going on in the world, don't miss what God is up to:

- Hearts are turning toward Him, with revival and renewal.
- People are bringing broken, shattered dreams to the only One who can fix it.
- Fear and instability is driving us to the one place that cannot be shaken: The Living God.
- And more than ever, we are reminded that Christ is the only "solid rock" who never totters and "all other ground is sinking sand."
- *I wonder: What else needs to be shaken or tottered so that God can accomplish His purposes?

3. - Be still! (v.8-11)

8 Come, behold the works of the Lord, how he has brought desolations on the earth. 9 He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the chariots with fire.

- *This is a typical Evening News Broadcast of war and trouble and desolation on earth.
 - *The Psalmist wants us to interpret WORLD events with this perspective: What is God up to?
 - *v.8 wants us to consider that even in unsettled times, God is on the throne doing His work!
 - *v.9 wants to remind us that God has **power to reverse the troubles of earth** in a moment.
- *As World Events are being considered, God interrupts the broadcast with BREAKING NEWS.
- 10 "Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!"
 - *It's the only time God speaks in Ps. 46...and He has a message of confidence for believers.
 - "Be still": Settle your emotions; Be calm; Stop pacing or wringing your hands; Don't unravel...
 - "And know": There is a truth to be embraced that will ease anxiety; calm fears; & restore hope.
 - "I am God. I will be exalted among the nations": God is still in charge. With everything being shaken, God is not shaken. He is accomplishing His work around the globe, for His glory.

- *I remain convinced that the times live in will cause the church to FLOURISH, not FLOUNDER.
- *I am convinced the shaking of our world will prove to be the best thing for the church, not the worst.
 - *It will rekindle a passion among the <u>churched</u>; renew faith among <u>dechurched</u>; and remind the <u>unchurched</u> how FRAIL we are and how FAITHFUL God is.
- *With God's voice breaking into troubled times, the Psalmist ends the chapter with this confidence:
 - 11 The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.
 - *This is why we have confidence in troubled times. God has not cancelled His presence.
 - *Your Dentist may be cancelled; God is not. Your gym may be closed; but God is still present.

Action Steps:

- Interrupt Bad News.
 - *Keep your Bible open to Psalm 46 this week; Read it every morning; Read it to kids at bedtime.
 - *Mute the TV during commercials, and read Psalm 46 during evening news.
 - *With all the bad news filling air waves, interrupt your brain waves with a reminder of Good News.

• Avoid Spiritual Distancing.

- *With all the talk of "social distancing" for health, it's time to close the gap on spiritual distancing.
- *Maybe you have been 'spiritual distancing' for far too long, and God has not been a priority in life.
- *This is a perfect opportunity to reprioritize the life of faith; to return to God for strength & help.

• Encourage Your Neighbor

- *Now is a time to love your neighbor. With all the isolation, to check in and encourage and pray.
- *Do you know your 6 closest neighbors? What could you do to offer help?

• Be Still. Know. God.

- *He offers a relationship of peace through His Son Jesus. A refuge in times of trouble. A Savior.
- *And come what may, the best news is the Hope of Resurrection. A Savior who conquers death.
- *Remind yourselves this week...though the earth gives way, we will not fear. God is with us.
