Start It Up

• Opening Icebreaker:

*In honor of Memorial Day, tell one story about a U.S. Veteran who is closest to you. What one way have they impacted your life?

Talk it Over

• Sermon in a Sentence:

•	The Lord surrounds His people,	(v.1-2)
•	and we are "under God,"	(v.3-5a)
•	so, Relax!	(v.5b)

- v.1-2 should be memorized by every Christian. Read it out loud as a group. How do these words comfort you? Describe one time in your life when you felt surrounded and protected by the Lord.
- David says that those who trust in the Lord "cannot be moved." Put this test to real life. Does it feel like your faith is indeed moved at times? What do you think David means by not being moved?
- Read David's prayer for his country and leaders in v.4-5. What would it look like to pray this today? Do you feel it's still appropriate to pray that God blesses leaders who do good and removes those who are crooked?
- This chapter ends with declaring "Peace" to the nation. On Sunday, Pastor Craig said it this way: "Relax!" We know how the story ends. What is your personal level of peace right now in our nation? Describe how confident you feel...or how uncertain you feel.

Pray it Over:

- Thank God for the freedoms of our nation, and the ability we have to worship.
- Pray David's prayer in v.4-5 for America, both our leaders and our people. Pray that we are "in tune" with God.
- Pray for the "re-opening" of New Hope. Pray that our elders have incredible wisdom to navigate the complexity; pray that the people who gather will be filled with grace and peace.
- Pray for businesses and organizations enduring massive changes due to the pandemic. Pray that the truth of Ps. 125 would comfort them and give them strength.
