Confidence in Dangerous Times

Psalm 11

This is the 5th sermon in Psalms of Confidence for times that are Troubled, Fearful, Anxious, Deadly...

*And today, Psalm 11 adds to that list by remaining "Confident in Dangerous Times."

1. Run to God in dangerous times, (v.1-3)

"In the Lord I take refuge; how can you say to my soul, "Flee like a bird to your mountain, 2 for behold, the wicked bend the bow; they have fitted their arrow to the string to shoot in the dark at the upright in heart; 3 if the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?"

*When things get dangerous (politically/personally) some people want to run and hide.

*Maybe you feel that way right now: You just everything to go back to safe & normal.

*David faced about every possible scenario of danger a person could face.

*Culturally, he led an economy through prosperity and recession.

*Politically, he had adversaries who wanted him removed from office.

*Personally, he and his family faced threats of physical harm or death.

*David had a cabinet of advisors who gave counsel: "Run. Go to the mountains. Fly like a bird."

*Their advice was logical. **Like Dr. Fauci with Trump,** they were concerned for the **physical safety** of David **and based on the data they saw,** recommended action.

*But instead of "Stay at Home," they recommended "Flee to the Mountains"

*In the words of **Gandalf**: "Fly you fool!"

*In the words of John Denver: "Leaving on a jet plane. Don't know when I'll be back..."

*The **economic fallout & risk of personal danger** convinced them that hope was gone:

"If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?"

IOW: Things in **culture** are **crumbling...** and there's nothing you can do...but Run!

*Let's relate this to our times. I have three questions: "Faith or Fear"

What "Red Line" (if crossed) would make you want to run?

*In 2012, Netanyahu told the UN, Iran had crossed a "Red Line" in nuclear program.

*When you look at our culture, what **Red Line** would make you want to flee for safety?

*Politically, some Americans say they will flee the country if they don't like a President.

*Before last election, a number of stars said they would flee the country if Trump was elected; Miley Cyrus, Whoopi Goldberg, Snoop Dogg, Samuel L Jackson, Cher (Jupiter)

*Gallup: Americans who want to leave the US permanently during...Bush; 11%. Obama; 10%. Trump; 16%. (The top destination to run to: Canada)

*Economically, some Americans decide to move to other states due to taxation.

*Bloomberg = Every year, 5 million Americans move states (New York being the biggest loser...Florida being the biggest winner).

*What about you fellow Michiganders...what would cause you to run for safety?

*Personally, some run away to avoid problems.

*In neighborhoods, some move because of issues with neighbors.

*In workplaces, some switch jobs because of conflict with coworkers.

*In families, some run from homes because of turmoil with family.

• Where would you run for safety?

*David's advisors said: "Go to the Mountains." If I had a choice, I'd go to Bozeman, Montana.

*And there are times to run. Jesus talks about fleeing to the mountains during tribulation.

"let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains." (Matt 24:16)

*Do you know where **Ralph, MI** is? Likely, not...unless you're a Yooper.

*It's a tiny place past Escanaba, with a small cabin, off the grid in the woods.

*From my childhood, that is the place my dad always joked about running in hard times.

*Well, even though running is an option, David chooses a place safer than Ralph or Bozeman.

Do you have courage to stand firm?

*The Bible says: "If you do not stand firm in faith, you will not stand at all."

*Advisors Perspective: "Flee!" Hope was lost; the only option David had was to run for safety.

*They probably even had logic, data, and an ounce of wisdom!

*David's Perspective: "How can you say..."

*Hope was not lost. He saw running from the trouble a lack of trust in God's promises

- *Yes, there may be times for the righteous to run...but there are times to stand firm.
- *The way David saw it:
 - *His advisors may have had counsel, but they lacked courage.
 - *His advisors may have had a plan, but they lacked perspective.
 - *His advisors may have had good data, but they lacked godly direction.
- *David has the courage to stand firm in faith even when everything in culture is crumbling:
 - "How can you say...Flee...hope is lost...or what can the righteous do...?
- *Northern MI, in these dangerous times there is a great need to stand firm in faith.
 - *Our world has a lot of **advisors** who have no faith in Living God.
- *David looks the advisors in the eye and says w/ confidence: "In the Lord, I take refuge."
 - *No matter what Fox News or CNN or Social Media says, the Lord is our refuge.
 - *No matter what happens with **China, the Lord is our refuge.**
 - *No matter who is elected as **President** or **Governor**, **the Lord is our refuge.**
 - *No matter if the foundations of American economy crumble, the Lord is our refuge.

2. (Run to God) ...because He is in charge, (v.4-6)

4 The Lord is in his holy temple; the Lord's throne is in heaven; his eyes see, his eyelids test the children of man. 5 The Lord tests the righteous, but his soul hates the wicked and the one who loves violence. 6 Let him rain coals on the wicked; fire and sulfur and a scorching wind shall be the portion of their cup.

*The advisors see no other option: "What can the righteous do, David, other than run?"

*David says: "Here's what we can do: Remember who God is and what He will do!"

*In the face of danger, David clings to 2 fundamental truths about God:

- He knows what's wrong. (v.4)
- He will fix it. (v.5-6)

- *He believes **Heaven oversees Hell.** That God is in charge...and we can trust Him.
- *I imagine people asking David: "Why is God allowing this? Why is the economy crumbling?"
- *To which David responds: "God is testing his people."
 - *Two times, he says that God: "test the children of man." "tests the righteous."
 - *IOW: David interprets the hardship as a DIVINE TEST of the human heart.
- *Perhaps God uses economic turmoil as way to revive a dead nation.

^{*}He genuinely believes that **Heaven** is God's throne, and **Earth** is His footstool.

*Perhaps God uses danger to see if people turn to Him, or away from Him.

*Perhaps God is testing to see if his people walk by faith or fear?

*This is how one 90 year old woman from NH sees it. (watches every Sunday from Indiana)

"Craig, I just had to write you and let you know what a joy it is to be able to watch you online during **this time of testing for our nation and the church.** We know that **God has a purpose in this** and my prayer, like yours, is that people will seek God and for revival for our country, the church and the world.

*Let me ask you: If our present crisis is a DIVINE TEST of your heart, are you passing?

*Are you walking by Faith or are you paralyzed by Fear?

*My friend, here is what the righteous can do when the **foundations of culture crumble**:

We walk with faith in the Risen Savior...fully confident of Who He is and What He will do.

3. ...and our future is secure. (v.7)

7 For the Lord is righteous; he loves righteous deeds; the upright shall behold his face.

- *This is David's closing argument for why he will not run or flee to the mountains of Bozeman.
- *First, he knows God is righteous...which means that God is completely and utterly good!
- *Second, he knows **God loves righteous deeds**...which means God will defend him against evil.
- *Third, he knows **the upright will behold God**...which means he has the future guarantee of God's presence.
- *What could be better news in dangerous times?
 - *God is good. He is with us. And His promise is never to leave us or forsake us.
 - *We don't have to fear. We don't have to run. We don't have to panic.

Action Step: "Run to God!"

*David says: "In the Lord I find refuge." He believes that the safest place to run in times of danger is not **Ralph, or Bozeman, or Canada,** but to the Lord.

*How do we do this?

- **Be Patient.** Wait on the Lord's timing. God has many chances to be early, but is never late.
- **Pray.** When fear rises up, cast your worries of the future to the Lord who daily bears us up.
- Listen to counsel, but don't always follow it. Many people give advice without faith in God.
- Keep Perspective. Take the long view. God has always been faithful and will always be faithful.
- Persevere. We have need of endurance. Endure hardship as a "good soldier of Jesus Christ."
- Cling to Promises. God sees what is wrong...and will one day fix it. His purposes & plans prevail.
