Session 5: The Importance of Sound Doctrine:

Part 1: What is sound doctrine?

- Some Key scriptures:
 - Jude 1:3
 - 1 Timothy 1:3-4
 - 1 Timothy 4:6-7
 - 1 Timothy 4:13, 16
- A few basic introductory thoughts:
 - It is a logically organized attempt to expound the most essential element of "the faith" or "sound doctrine:"
 - It begins with going to the scriptures to study what they say about these matters.
 - It through diligent study puts together a well-organized, logically connected body of facts that we can pass on to the next generation.

Part 2: What are some practical reasons to study doctrine?

- Reason 1: American Christianity is filled with ignorance, confusion, and thoroughly unbiblical concepts:
- Reason 2: The church will crumble in a culture if sound doctrine is not being regularly expounded:
- Reason 3: False Teaching is personally destructive to people's lives:
- Reason 4: What we do begins with what we are and what we believe:
 - o Values begin with the Creator's design and purpose.
 - What we believe must be rooted in an objective authority.
 - The enabling to live the Christian life begins with conversion and an understanding of how God matures people.
- Reason 5: We must articulate doctrine with clarity:
 - We need to know what the scriptures teach about foundational matters.
 - We need to know the primary scriptures that address these issues.
 - We need to know the terms.
 - We need to be aware of the debates and how they are affecting the people we love.
 - We need to communicate sound doctrine effectively.

Part 3: What does scripture say about studying sound doctrine?

- The great commission commands us to teach sound doctrine:
 Matthew 28:20
- The New Testament pattern for teaching begins with sound doctrine:
 - Romans: Doctrine 1-11/Practical Implications 12-16
 - Ephesians: Doctrine 1-3/Practical Implications 4-6
 - Colossians: Doctrine 1-2/Practical Implications 3-4
- The apostles' final words command us to teach sound doctrine:
 - 2 Timothy 3:10; 2 Timothy 4:2; Titus 1:9; Titus 2:1; 2
 John 1:10; 2 Peter 3:1-2

Part 4: What are some specific areas of doctrine that we must teach to the whole church?

- What is scripture and is it without error?
- What books are actual scripture?
- Who is God?
- What is trinity and why does it matter?
- How does God's sovereignty relate to sin, suffering, and salvation?
- Who is Christ?
- What is man?
- What is marriage and why does it matter?
- How are sinful people reconciled to God?
- What is the gospel and what does it accomplish?
- What is the church and why does it matter?
- What is the church mandated to be doing?
- Who should be overseeing and instructing the church?
- What is the ultimate hope for the Christian?

Part 5: How should the church teach sound doctrine?

- Preaching: Our preaching should exegetically sound and theologically rich expositions.
- **Teaching in the class setting**: We need to thoroughly address these critical questions.
- **Teaching one on one or in small groups**: Discipleship especially in the formative early years after someone's conversion.
- **Christian fellowship**: We should be growing in our love for sound doctrine so that it is naturally a part of our Christian relationships.
