The enemy often uses your <u>blessings</u> to make me <u>miserable</u>.

When we don't have a proper <u>perspective</u> of the Father it is easy for the enemy to convince us that this is about us.

John 8:44 (NLT) For you are the children of your father the devil, and you love to do the evil things he does. He was a murderer from the beginning. He has always hated the

truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, it is consistent with his character; for he is a liar and the father of lies.
