“What must I do to be saved?”

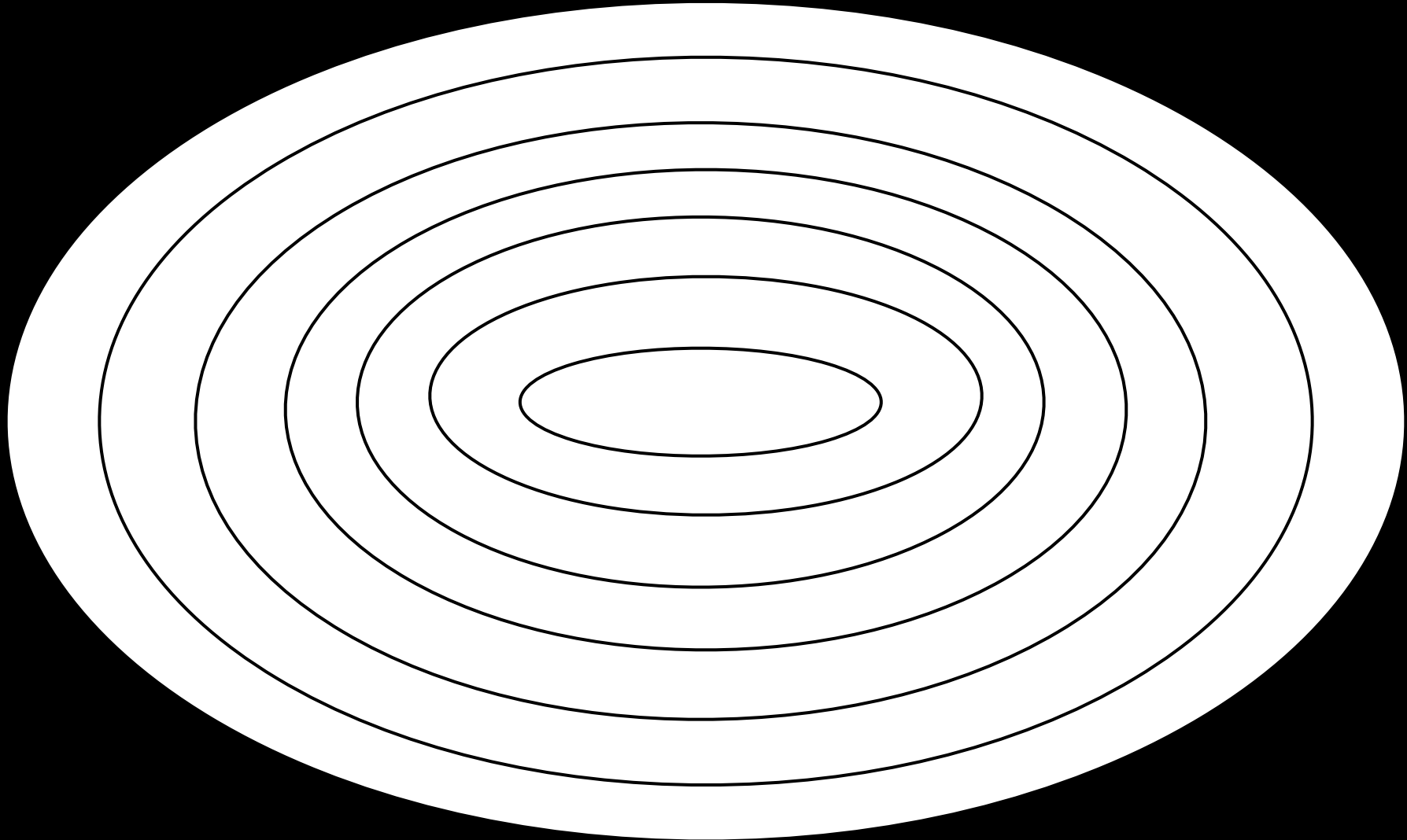
The Law's Answer:

Love God with your entire being (Deut. 6:5)

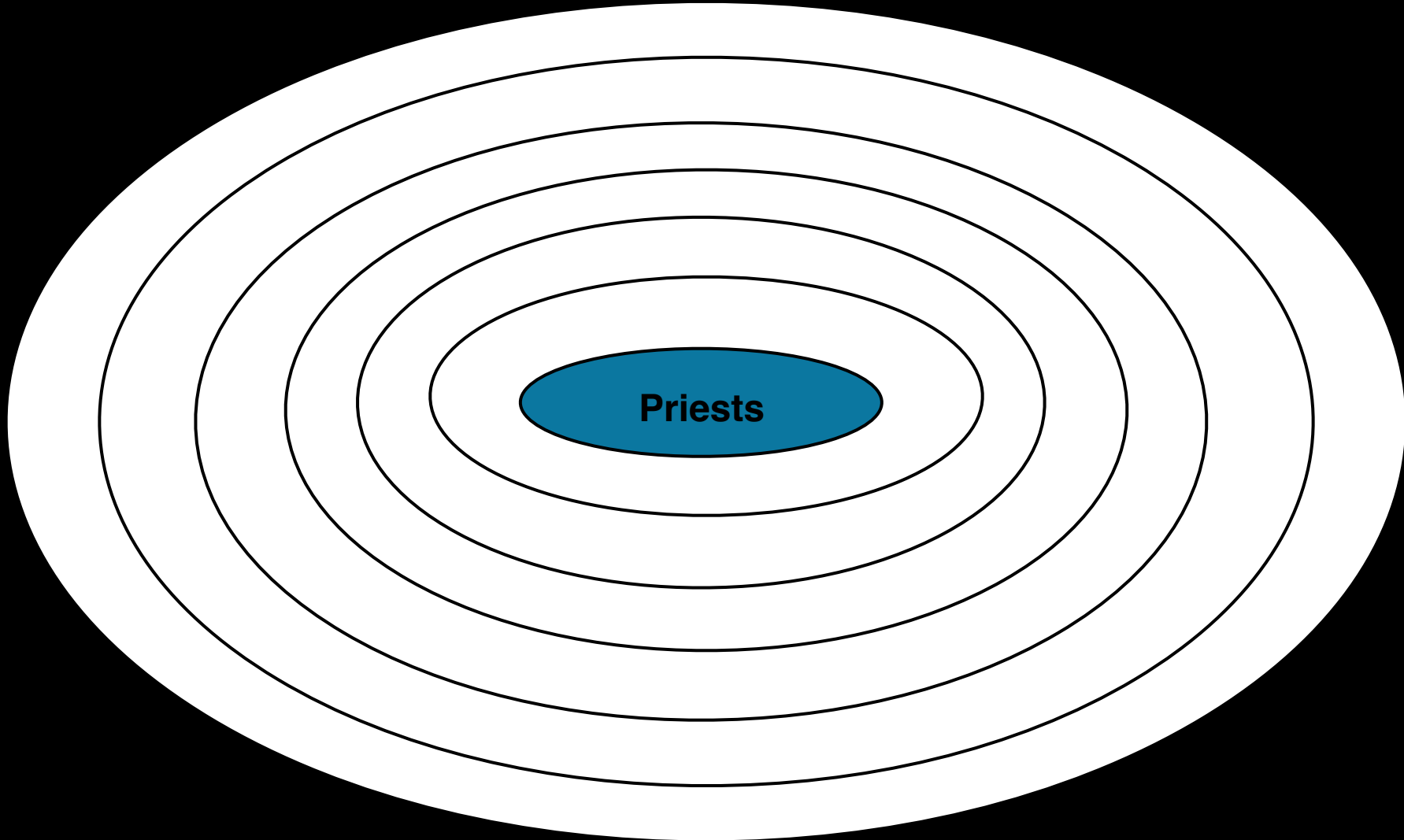
Love your neighbor as yourself (Lev. 19:18)
