

Luke 1:57-80

Now the time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son.

58 And her neighbours and relatives heard that the Lord had shown great mercy to her, and they rejoiced with her. ⁵⁹ And on the eighth day they came to circumcise the child. And they would have called him Zechariah after his father, 60 but his mother answered, "No; he shall be called John." 61 And they said to her, "None of your relatives is called by this name." 62 And they made signs to his father, inquiring what he wanted him to be called. 63 And he asked for a writing tablet and wrote, "His name is John." And they all wondered.

64 And immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue loosed, and he spoke, blessing God. 65 And fear came on all their neighbours. And all these things were talked about through all the hill country of Judea, 66 and all who heard them laid them up in their hearts, saying, "What then will this child be?" For the hand of the Lord was with him.
67 And his father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied, saying,

- ⁷⁰ as he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets from of old,

- ⁷² to show the mercy promised to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant,
- ⁷³ the oath that he swore to our father Abraham, to grant us
- that we, being delivered from the hand of our enemies, might serve him without fear,
- in holiness and righteousness before him all our days.
- ⁷⁶ And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways,

- ⁷⁷ to give knowledge of salvation to his people in the forgiveness of their sins,
- ⁷⁸ because of the tender mercy of our God, whereby the sunrise shall visit us from on high
- ⁷⁹ to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."
- ⁸⁰ And the child grew and became strong in spirit, and he was in the wilderness until the day of his public appearance to Israel.

Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to call him John. 14 He will be a joy and delight to you, and many will rejoice because of his birth, ¹⁵ for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to take wine or other fermented drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even before he is born. ¹⁶ He will bring back many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. ¹⁷ And he will go on before the Lord, in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the parents to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous – to make ready a people prepared for the Lord.'
