- 1. Set clear boundaries
- 2. Understand what's going on (in them and in you).
- 3. Walk with your child in addressing the needs

Discuss these scenarios...

1. Your child is playing with toys on the floor with a couple of other kids. He/she grabs a toy from another child and bowls them over in the process. The other child starts crying.



Discuss these scenarios...

2. Your child wanders into an area they shouldn't. They're kindly asked to go out because they're not allowed in there. Your child says no. They say they don't have to do what the adult tells them to.



Discuss these scenarios...

3. You put your child to bed. Five minutes later they come back out. You send them back. Three minutes later they come out again. You tell them a third time, and two minutes later she comes out, looking sheepish, standing at the door.



Discuss these scenarios...

4. Your adolescent child gets home from school. You say hello. They brush straight past you, don't even look at you, go to their room and slam the door.
