GOD'S PROPHETIC CALL TO SAMUEL

1 Samuel 3

PERIOD OF TIME FOR GOD'S CALL: AN UNFAITHFUL ISRAEL

- When Samuel ministered to the LORD before Eli (1 Samuel 3:1;
 2:11, 2:18)
- When God's Word was rare (1 Samuel 3:1)
- When the eyes of Eli were dim (1 Samuel 3:2, 1 Samuel 4:15)
- When <u>laying down</u> (1 Samuel 3:2, 3:3, 3:9)
- Before the lamp of God went out (1 Samuel 3:3, Ex. 30:7-8)

PERCEIVING GOD'S CALL INVOLVES: LISTENING AND A READY RESPONSE

- Samuel did not delay, he ran (1 Samuel 3:4,5)
- Samuel did not yet know the Lord (1 Samuel 3:7)
- Samuel received Godly instruction from Eli (1 Samuel 3:9)
 "Speak LORD, for Your servant is listening."
- Samuel <u>readily responded</u> to God (1 Samuel 3:10) "Speak, for Your Servant is listening."

Verses 4-10

PURPOSE OF GOD'S CALL: FULFILMENT OF HIS PROMISES

Verses 11-14

- Message was <u>fearful</u> (1 Samuel 3:11)
 - Jeremiah compares the destruction of Shiloh with that of Jerusalem (Jer. 7:12, 14; 26:6)
- Message was <u>certain</u> (1 Samuel 3:12)
 - Every promised outcome "from beginning to end" would come to pass (v.12, see prophecy in 1 Samuel 2:27-36)
 - "the iniquity which he knew" (v.13)
 - could "never be atoned for by sacrifice or offering" (v.14)
- Message was just (1 Samuel 3:13 "Judge"; 1 Samuel 2:29; Deut. 6:5, 7:9-10; Mt. 10:37)
- Message of <u>eternal consequence</u> (1 Sam. 3:14)

PROPER RESPONSE TO GOD'S CALL: FAITH & OBEDIENCE IN <u>ALL</u> CIRCUMSTANCES

- Obey and do not <u>hide</u> God's Word (v. 15-18); Speak the <u>entire</u> counsel of God in the face of <u>fear</u> ("Samuel was afraid," v.15)
- God's people should: (v. 17,18)
 - want His <u>Word</u>;
 - hear His Voice;
 - receive His Word

Verses 15-18

PRODUCT OF OBEDIENCE: GOD WITH US

- "The LORD was with Samuel" (v. 19) and God let "none of his words fail."
- God blessed his ministry as a prophet (v. 20) which spread throughout "All Israel, from Dan to Beersheba"
- "The LORD continued to appear at Shiloh" (v. 21)
- Jesus: God's Son, <u>Immanuel</u>, Wisdom, Word, Priest Most High and our Eternal King (Is. 7:14, 2 Sam. 7:16, Mt. 1:22-23)

HOW DOES THIS APPLY TO ME?

Listen to and faithfully obey God in all circumstances; Do not ignore sin: repent and avoid its eternal consequences.

"We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters the inner shrine behind the curtain, where Jesus, a forerunner on our behalf, has entered, having become a high priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek."
