## Touching the Truth: The Tangible Hope of Easter John 20:24-31

**WHAT IS TRUE AND WHAT TO DO?** The Bible says the best person you know (moral, religious, pious) is dead in sin and condemned by God (Jn. 3:3, 16–19, 36), but the one who trusts in Jesus and confesses and commits to Him will receive eternal life (Jn. 5:24–29, 39; 8:23–25, 14:6, 17:3). So, by faith, believe in Jesus as Lord and Savior today! (Jn. 11:20, 20:29, 31)

- 1.) The details of doubt (v. 24-25)
  - A. Jesus really died
  - B. Jesus was buried in a sealed and guarded tomb
  - C. The tomb was found <u>empty</u> on Easter morning
  - D. The risen Lord was seen, touched, and heard
- 2.) The problem of doubt (v. 20:25, Jn. 3:3, 16–19, 36)
  - A. You will die in your sins; you will not have eternal life
- **3.)** The <u>solution</u> for doubt (v. 26–31)
  - A. Given time to reflect upon the truth... (v. 25–26; 14:6)
    - 1. Do not be <u>faithless</u> (v. 27)
    - 2. Believe, confess, and commit to Jesus (v. 27–31)
      - $\circ$  as the One who <u>rose</u> from the dead (v. 27)
      - o as your Lord (Master of your life, v. 28)
      - o as your <u>God</u> (the Son of God, v. 28)
      - as your <u>Savior</u> (Messiah; you have life in His name and by His blood, v. 31)
      - by faith in the <u>Word of God</u> and the disciples' <u>testimony</u> (v. 30)

**THE PURPOSE OF JOHN'S GOSPEL (v. 20:30–31):** <sup>30</sup> Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. <sup>31</sup> But these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.
