Devotional Content

Day & Title	Key Verse	Text	Big Idea
Introduction: The Call to Holiness	1 Peter 1:15-16	1 Peter 1:13-16	The call to holiness is to set our hope on the grace of God through Jesus.
Day One: The Community of Holiness	1 Peter 2:9	1 Peter 2:4-9	The community of holiness is God's consecrated people, filled with his presence, to declare his perfect goodness.
Day Two: The Challenge of Holiness	1 Peter 2:11	1 Peter 2:10-11	The challenge of holiness is that we are called to a holy life as exiles with corrupted passions in a fallen world.
Day Three: The Conduct of Holiness	1 Peter 2:12	1 Peter 2:10-12	The conduct of holiness is a life of good deeds that glorifies God and draws others to do the same.
Day Four: The Crux of Holiness	1 Peter 2:24	1 Peter 2:21-25	The crux of holiness is the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross that we might die to sin and live to righteousness.
Day Five: The Commitment of Holiness	1 Peter 3:15	1 Peter 3:13-16	The commitment of holiness is an inward devotion affecting our hearts and minds and an outward expression preparing us to testify of our hope in him.
Conclusion: The Crucible of Holiness	1 Peter 4:12-13	1 Peter 4:1-5, 12-16	The crucible of holiness is human suffering where our faith is tested, and we learn to rejoice as God's glory is revealed in and through us.
