REST (EX 31:12-18)

The Hebrew root word spans several meaning all of which come into play in our understanding means to CEASE or stop, to come to an end, to rest, and to CELEBRATE. The observance of the Sabbath was also a SIGN for the Israelites. It was a way for them to remember God, His deliverance, guidance, and blessing to the people - in essence a way for them to “know God” (v 13). As Christians, the Sabbath helps focus on Christ, and it should be a day for us to avoid distractions that lead us away from the rest and peace that are found only in Him. The Sabbath is a divine GIFT.!

REBELLION (EX 32:1-10)

In the plain view of the physical manifestation of Yahweh, the people turned their back on the COVENANT because they got tired of waiting for Moses! When we really take a long hard look at our lives, and our attitudes, we will see ourselves in the SAME position as the Israelites, at one time or another.

RIGHTEOUS INDIGNATION (EX 32:11-35)

The word God uses to describe what the Israelites had done is the same word that God used to describe the condition of the earth prior to the Flood of Noah's time - they had utterly come to RUIN. After everything Moses had gone through for the Israelites and after all that God had brought the Israelites through. The FAITHLESSNESS of the Israelites caused Moses to become angry with a righteous indignation-and rightfully so! Moses exercised righteous indignation appropriately. Calling out those that vowed to “do all that the LORD commands” and then turned around and did precisely what he did NOT command.

REPENTANCE (EX 32:30-35)

Repentance is so very necessary when we sin. There is a negative and a positive aspect here. There is a turning away from sin (NEGATIVE) and a turning toward God (POSITIVE). Repentance doesn't automatically ERASE consequences for repeatedly turning away from God. EVERY action that we make has consequences - good or bad. Repenting and turning to God does not necessarily free one from earthly consequences of our actions - because that is not what repentance is for.

CONCLUSION

There has been an underlying theme through our study: You can see Christ EVERYWHERE ! How blessed it is to have a Savior who loves us enough to reprove us and discipline us so that we shall see how we err in our walk with Him, and how blessed that He has made a way for us to be cleansed from all unrighteousness.
