# HOW DO I DEEPEN MY RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD? (PART FOUR)

Our devotional time with god should help us cultivate a devotional heart for him to the point where there is no longer a separation between our prayer time and our life of prayer.

We have many questions about the will of god. One way to resolve the mystery of seeking his will for specific things in our lives is to make sure that we are aligned with God's general and universal will for all of humanity.

### 1 THESSALONIANS 5:16-18 // NIV

16 Rejoice always, 17 pray continually, 18 give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

Rejoice. Pray. Give thanks. These three verses are not suggestions but commands from God.

Paul was in prison when he wrote to the church of Philippi. Even though he was suffering himself, Paul shows us that those who are in the Lord can REJOICE amidst all things.

### PHILIPPIANS 4:4-5 // NIV

4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice! 5 Let your gentle spirit be known to all men. The Lord is near.

Don't postpone prayer to time in your prayer closet. As the Spirit speaks to you, PRAY continually, confess, and respond in the present moment.

### PHILIPPIANS 4: 6-7 // NIV

6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God. 7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

## **EPHESIANS 6:18 // NIV**

And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests... and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people.

We've also lost something crucial. All those little moments of boredom were potential portals to prayer. Little moments throughout our days to wake up to the reality of God all around us. To wake up to our own souls.

To draw our minds' attention and devotion back to God; to come off the hurry drug and come home to awareness.
