What did they say Jesus was guilty of in verse five?

Why do you think Herod was delighted to see Jesus in verse 8-10?

Like King Herod, do you think people today are interested in Jesus only for His miracles or what He can do for them?

How is this missing who Jesus is and why He came?

What final judgment did Pilot give Jesus and why?

What does it mean when Jason said the most important thing about the cross was not His pain, but His purpose?

While Jesus was on the grass, the people mocked Him. What did they say?

Why was that response similar to people's reaction today?

When Jesus died on the cross, the curtain in the temple tore in half. What Significance did this have and what did it mean?

Jesus last words on the cross were "Father I place my life in your hands."

TOOK

In your last breath, who would you say you've put your trust?

Why did the people who watched the crucifixion say "surely this man was the Son of God " and then went away grieving?

What did you learn new tonight about Jesus trial and crucifixion?

PRAY

As we study the cross today, we see that the cross was not merely just about the pain, but it was about Christ great purpose for dying on it.

Accept His forgiveness for your sins and surrender your life to Him dedicating tomorrow for His service.
