"What Speaks To You?" - 2 Peter 1:16-21

Opening Question:

Opening Question: In our noisy world, what voices or sources of information do you tend to listen to most? Why?

Discussion Questions:

1. The sermon mentions we encounter about 400 marketing messages daily. How do you think this constant barrage of information affects our ability to discern truth?
2. Peter emphasizes the importance of eyewitness accounts. Why do you think firsthand experiences should be so powerful in shaping our beliefs?
3. The sermon contrasts "cleverly contrived myths" with real events like the Transfiguration. How can we distinguish between compelling stories and genuine spiritual experiences in our own lives?
4. Discuss the significance of multiple testimonies in establishing the truth of Jesus' life and ministry. How does this compare to religions based on a single person's claims? Why is one preferable to the next?
5. Have you ever been attracted to ideas that sounded good in theory but didn't align with biblical truth? How did you navigate that?
6. What role do you think personal testimonies play in sharing our faith and combating spiritual opposition?

Practical Applications:

1. Choose a Gospel account of an event in Jesus' life and compare it with other Gospel versions. Notice the consistency and unique details each provides.
2. Commit to reading a portion of Scripture daily, looking for connections and cross-references that reinforce its message.
3. Identify one area where you've been relying more on popular theories or cultural messages than biblical truth. Research what Scripture says about this topic.
