

Small Group Questions

1. Jesus, knowing exactly who He was, willingly took the position of a servant and washed His disciples' feet. What does His example teach us about the relationship between humility and serving others?
2. The sermon says, "Serving others is never beneath you." Are there certain tasks, roles, or people you are tempted to consider "beneath" you? What might it look like to follow Jesus' example in those situations?
3. Jesus washed Judas' feet even though He knew Judas would betray Him. How does that challenge the way we think about serving people who have disappointed, hurt, or mistreated us?
4. Sometimes receiving help requires just as much humility as giving it. Why can it be difficult to allow someone else to serve us? How might refusing help sometimes reveal pride or an unwillingness to be vulnerable?
5. Jesus said, "You will be blessed if you do them." How have you experienced God changing your heart, strengthening your faith, or blessing you through serving someone else?
6. 1 Peter 4:10 says that each of us should use the gifts we have received to serve others. What gifts, abilities, experiences, or resources has God given you that you could use to serve the church or someone around you this week? What is one practical step you could take?
