Pastor Ben's Corner

Being Reformed 1 Peter 2:5

"You yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ."

We just celebrated "Reformation Sunday last week. A Sunday set aside to celebrate the reformation sparked by Martin Luther's 95 Theses, on October 31, 1517. As I reflect on this celebration, I couldn't help but remember that the reforming power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ was a lifetime reformation for Martin Luther. I actually taught a class on this last year at Immanuel entitled, "The Development of Martin Luther's Theology". But the reformation was not just a movement that helped Christians rediscover the Gospel, it was a very personal reformation of the man, that would take place over the course of Martin Luther's life.

Just to highlight a few moments. Luther went from a law student caught in a Lightning storm promising St. Anne that if she saved him, he would become a monk to stating in the Smalcald Articles, regarding invoking the saint, that it is "neither commanded nor counseled, nor has it any warrant in Scripture." He went from, as a monk, spending hours in confession, working his fingers to the bone, and some even say, committing acts of self flagellation, in order to obtain God's love, to declaring, "This mystery of the riches of divine grace for sinners; for by a wonderful exchange our sins are now not ours but Christ's, and Christ's righteousness is not Christ's but ours."

The list could go on and on. At times, Luther would alter his theological stances in light of what the Word of God revealed. So what is the point? The point is simply this, Martin Luther did not go through a one-time reformation; rather, he was daily being reformed by the unchanging Word of God and the Gospel that it proclaimed.

The same is true for each of us. We are all, daily, to be changed by the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We are to grow in our knowledge of who God has revealed Himself to be.

In 1 Peter 2:5 (quoted at the beginning of this article) we are reminded of the truth that we are "BEING built into a spiritual house". In other words, it isn't complete; our faith, our knowledge, our reliance upon the Grace of God is in a constant state of being reformed.

Here is a worldly example. When I attended my brother's and sister in-law's wedding in Jakarta, Indonesia, as they gave us a tour of their neighborhood, I couldn't help but recognize that almost all of the houses were under construction. When I asked my brother about this, he responded, "Oh, that is because the family isn't done yet; they are always adding onto the houses to make space for future generations." The buildings are always under construction, because the growth isn't done yet.

The same is true in the reformation the Holy Spirit brings our hearts into; it is always under construction. Our faith always has room to grow. That is why it is so vital that we as believers, study God's Word, that we not become content with the idea that "Well, now I know enough." Until God calls us to His side, rescuing us from death and condemnation, we don't know enough. We must be in a continual state of being reformed.

This becomes all the more pressing because, as we know, Satan doesn't stop attacking us once we are called to faith, rather, he doubles down on his efforts. That is why Paul says in Romans 12:2, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." In other words be reformed, so that this world does not seek to claim what Christ has already paid for. We are constantly being reformed and thank God, as He continually reforms our faith and draws us ever more into His Grace.

Pointing to the Rock of Ages

Not the labor of my hands Can fulfill Thy Law's demands; Could my zeal no respite know, Could my tears forever flow, All for sin could not atone; Thou must save, and Thou alone. (LSB 761:2)

While the classic hymn "Rock of Ages" shows up in the *Lutheran Service Book* in the "Hope and Comfort" section, it can also teach us a valuable lesson about Christian stewardship. If that surprises you, stay with me on this one.

No Lutheran would ever dispute the fact that our work does not save us. Ephesians 2 makes it truly clear that we are dead in our trespasses and sins and would remain in that state until Christ raises us by grace. There is not a ladder on which we can climb out of the grave that our sins have dug for us. No blood, sweat nor tears will be able to rescue us. We all know this.

Our works do not save. Christ's work on the cross of Calvary does! He bore human flesh. He carried the burden of our sin to the cross. His body was beaten, bruised and bloodied for us. He has indeed atoned for us! This is more than enough reason for this hymn to be bouncing around in your head all day today!

But our work has a place. The place is in response to what the Father has done for us in Jesus. The Rock of Ages, who is Jesus, becomes the foundation on which our lives of faith are built. The Holy Spirit uses the means of grace to make us God's workmanship that Paul talks about in Ephesians 2:10.

Our workmanship does not display our power or prowess. Like the heavens declare the handiwork of the Creator, the works of a redeemed sinner point others to the salvation that is worked only by Jesus alone. Our work is a response to and reflection of a grace and glory that we ourselves could never accomplish or achieve.

We become stewards of the treasure that is the Gospel. When we faithfully support the work of the Gospel of Jesus Christ with our financial support, we are doing the work which points to the One who alone atones. When we come alongside a struggling sister or brother for whom Christ died and we share the stewardship work of compassion and care, we enflesh the treasure of God's love and redemption. When we make it a weekly priority to arrange our schedule to be in the Lord's House with other stewards of the Gospel to receive again and again the Gospel's precious gift, we are stewards of the Body of Christ in the congregation that points even more people to Jesus.

We cannot do this. Jesus does it through us. We are simply stewards of this precious treasure!

News from Pastor Tiews September 21, 2025 **Sharing the Gospel in** Germany

Dear Friends and Supporters...

... of our ministry to Germany and across Eurasia! I think dear

ol' Martin Luther would be absolutely stunned to see that roughly half a millennium after his rediscovery of the Gospel, Christian converts from Muslim lands would be proudly posing at the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, where Luther posted his 95 Theses in 1517. But that is exactly what happened when we led a group of 17 Iranian Lutherans from Hamburg last week to the city in which the Reformation started. I was amazed by how much they "got into" Lutheran history, as we toured the Castle Church (where Luther posted his 95 Theses), the "City Church" (aka St. Mary's, the church at which Luther served, alongside Johannes Bugenhagen), and saw his home, the former Augustinian monastery.

We had a most enjoyable and edifying threeday, two-night retreat in Wittenberg, one of the most important cities of Christianity, staying at the Old Latin School, the LCMS venue in the heart of town—literally a stone's throw away from the City Church. We had chapel and devotions every day, and our Iranian friends fortified their knowledge of Lutheran Christianity in the very place where it all started.

Dear friends and supporters, if you have never been to Wittenberg, perhaps you would like to join us next September, as we offer another opportunity to experience Persian (and other kinds of) ministry in Germany first-hand? Mark your calendars: the next Germany "FORO" is scheduled for September 23-29, 2026. And as always, all of this mission work would not be possible without the love and support of YOU ALL!

Thank you all for keeping the Tiews going out here on the mission field, and praise God for the many ways in which He is blessing His work that we are so privileged to do!




The 2nd Annual BOAR'S HEAD CHRISTMAS FESTIVAL is coming soon!


