Pastor Watley is concluding his month-long series entitled "It's My Pleasure" today with the sermon entitled "Optimal Performance". In his introduction, Pastor shares about a trip that he and Lady Shawna took overseas to pick up a foreign car. This car company had a program that helped those who made this trip, save money on the overall experience. Pastor shares that as he was driving the car, he was informed that although the car could go fast, it was best for them to not push the speed beyond 80 miles per hour until the car has at least 800 miles on it. They call this the "break-in" period. The car while new still needs to get used to the way it should drive and the way you will drive as the owner. Pastor points out that the company told him if he wanted to get the best out of the car, the optimal performance, he couldn't go too fast too soon.

In the same way, the company explained to Pastor the instructions on getting the most out of the car, Pastor shares that as Christians, the Bible is our manual to teach us how to get the most out of Christian life. Getting the most out of this Christian life Pastor says is linked to this statement. "God did not save us to sit, God saved us to serve." Pastor lists several scriptures today but begins with the foundation scripture for Kingdom Fellowship AME Church.



Pastor Watley shared that God showed him the scripture Mark 1:15 at the launching of Kingdom Fellowship. This scripture as Pastor shared, is linked to us representing the Kingdom and sharing its Good News. Pastor Watley says that the Kingdom of God is already here but not yet and he teaches us the term "Inaugurated Eschatology". This term means that God has already done it even though we haven't seen it yet. God's working is in process in our lives which is why we don't always see the Kingdom of God at hand, but it is on its way through us. Pastor uses this next scripture to helps us see how someone grows in their faith.









Pastor lists these points that not only happen in the scripture but we must do in our own lives:
