WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Communion

Communion, or "The Lord's Supper," is one of the two main sacraments in the life of the church (the other is baptism). A sacrament is a visible ceremony that expresses invisible spiritual truths.

Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper before his death as a way for his followers to regularly rehearse and live into what has happened through the gospel. Believers have been united to Jesus in his death and resurrection, and also united with one another as part of God's family. When we partake of the bread and the cup we remind ourselves of these truths and experience in the present the grace those historic events have brought into our life. In a very real way, around the table we commune with the risen Jesus together, by faith.

Those who have trusted in Christ's saving work are welcome to come to the table during this time of our gathering. As we receive the elements, we repent of sin and receive again God's grace, reorienting us to the gospel, reminding us of the forgiveness and cleansing we find in Christ, and causing us to rejoice in him.
