Ezekiel 2:1–7

³He said to me, "Son of man, I am sending you to the people of Israel, to disloyal nations, who have been disloyal to me. They and their fathers have rebelled against me to this very day. ⁴These children of mine are brazen-faced and hard-hearted. If we deny him, he will also deny us;


¹³If we are faithless, he remains faithful, because he cannot deny himself.



Lord's Prayer


