

FIRST READING Leviticus 19:9-16 | EHV

⁹ When you reap the harvest from your land, you are not to finish reaping all the way to the edge of the field. Do not gather up the gleanings of your harvest. ¹⁰ Do not strip your vineyard clean, and do not pick up the fallen grapes from your vineyard, but leave them for the poor and the alien who live with you. I am the LORD your God.

¹¹ You shall not steal. You shall not swindle. You shall not lie to one another. ¹² You shall not swear falsely by my name so that you do not profane the name of your God. I am the LORD.

¹³ You shall not exploit your neighbor. You shall not rob him. You shall not keep the wages of a day laborer with you overnight until morning.

SECOND READING James 2:14-26 | EHV

¹⁴ What good is it, my brothers, if someone says that he has faith but has no works? Such "faith" cannot save him, can it? ¹⁵ If a brother or sister needs clothes and lacks daily food ¹⁶ and one of you tells them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well," but does not give them what their body needs, what good is it? ¹⁷ So also, such "faith," if it is alone and has no works, is dead. ¹⁸ But someone will say, "You have faith, and I have works." Show me your faith without works, and I will show you my faith by my works.

¹⁹ You believe that God is one. Good for you! Even the demons believe that—and shudder! ²⁰ But do you want proof, you mindless person, that such "faith" without works is dead? ²¹ Wasn't Abraham our father shown to be righteous by works when he offered Isaac his son on the altar? ²² You see that his faith was working together with his works, and by his works his faith was shown to be complete. ²³ And the Scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness." He was also called God's

friend. ²⁴ You see that a person is shown to be righteous by works and not by faith alone.

²⁵ In the same way also, wasn't Rahab the prostitute shown to be righteous by works when she welcomed the spies and sent them out another way? ²⁶ For just as the body without breath is dead, so also faith without works is dead.


