They seemed to follow Jesus almost as closely as his disciples did, but their motive was often very different. In so many gospel accounts about the life of Jesus, they were visible—sometimes in the background, often in his face. They weren't there to learn in humility. Rather, they listened intently, hoping they could catch him speaking false doctrine or saying something they could use to discredit him before his followers. Of course, we are talking about the Pharisees. The Pharisees are the bad guys in the gospel accounts. They imagined they were the spiritual models for the Jewish nation, but they were forever clashing with the very Son of God. Though some have suggested that Jesus' message bore a resemblance to the message of the Pharisees, a closer look reveals that they were irreconcilable.

In our Bible study, *Irreconcilable!*, we will take an in-depth look at the Pharisees and the teachings that brought them in conflict with Jesus. We do that, not simply as an academic study, but to fortify ourselves against the leaven of the Pharisees that often lurks within our own hearts and to show even more clearly how the message of salvation is superior through Jesus.
