He calls their children and their children's children to account for the guilt of the fathers, even to the third and the fourth generation." ⁸Moses quickly bowed to the ground and worshipped. ⁹He said, "If I have now found favor in your sight, Lord, please let the Lord go along with us. Although this is a stiff-necked people, pardon our guilt and our sin, and accept us as your possession."

Second Reading

Romans 10:5-13 (EHV)

Indeed, Moses writes this about the righteousness that comes by the law: “The one who does these things will live by them.”⁶But the righteousness that comes by faith speaks like this: “Do not say in your heart, ‘Who will ascend into heaven?’” (that is, to bring Christ down)⁷or ‘Who will descend into the abyss?’” (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead).⁸But what does it say? “The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart,” that is, the word of faith that we are proclaiming.⁹Certainly, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.¹⁰For it is with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and it is with the mouth that a person confesses, resulting in salvation.¹¹For Scripture says, “Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame.”¹²So there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, because the same Lord is Lord of all, who gives generously to all who call on him.¹³Yes, “Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”
