

All have sinned and fall short of the glory and perfection of God,


But God declares all people to be holy through the payment Jesus made for all sin.

our sal - va - tion. Let us come into his presence with thanks-giv - ing,







¹² Dear friends, do not be surprised by the fiery trial that is happening among you to test you, as if something strange were happening to you. ¹³ Instead rejoice whenever you are sharing in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed.

¹⁴ If you are insulted in connection with the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. ¹⁵ Make sure that none of you suffers as a murderer, a thief, a criminal, or as a meddler. ¹⁶ But if you suffer for being a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God in connection with this name. ¹⁷ For the time has come for judgment to begin with the household of God. Now if it begins with us, what will be the end for those who disobey the gospel of God? ¹⁸ And if it is hard for the righteous to be saved, where will the ungodly sinner end up? ¹⁹ So let those who suffer according to the will of God entrust their souls to their faithful Creator while doing what is good.

Peter answered him, “You are the Christ.”




