#### **Passion Reading for Week Five**

Mark 14:66 - 15:15 (EHV)

Peter Denies Jesus, Jesus' Trial in Pilate's Court, Barabbas or Jesus?

P: Pastor M: Men W: Women

- P: While Peter was in the courtyard below, one of the servant girls of the high priest came there. When she saw Peter warming himself, she looked directly at him and said,
- W: "You were also with the Nazarene, Jesus!"
- M: But he denied it, saying, "I don't know or understand what you are saying," and he went out to the entryway. Then a rooster crowed.
- P: When the servant girl saw him, once more she began to tell those standing there,
- W: "This is one of them."
- P: But again he denied it. After a little while those who were standing there said to Peter, "Surely you are one of them, because you are a Galilean."
- M: But he began to curse and to swear, "I do not know this man you are talking about!" Just then, the rooster crowed for the second time.

  Then Peter remembered what Jesus had said to him:
- P: "Before the rooster crows twice, you will deny me three times." And he broke down and wept.

- W: As soon as it was morning, the chief priests, along with the elders, the experts in the law, and the whole Sanhedrin, reached a decision. They bound Jesus, led him away, and handed him over to Pilate.
- M: Pilate asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?"
- P: He answered him, "It is as you say."
- M: The chief priests accused him of many things. Pilate questioned him again, "Are you not going to answer anything? See how many charges they are bringing against you!"
- W: But Jesus still did not answer anything, so Pilate was amazed.
- P: At each Festival, Pilate used to release to the people one prisoner whom they requested. There was one named Barabbas, who was imprisoned with the rebels and had committed murder in the rebellion. The crowd came up and began to ask Pilate to do for them what he usually did.
- M: Pilate replied, "Do you want me to release the King of the Jews to you?" In fact, he knew that it was because of envy that the chief priests had handed him over.
- W: But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release Barabbas to them instead.
- M: Again, Pilate replied to them, "Then what do you want me to do with the man you call the King of the Jews?"
- W: "Crucify him!" they shouted back.
- M: But Pilate said to them, "Why? What has he done wrong?"
- W: But they shouted even louder, "Crucify him!"
- P: Since he wanted to satisfy the crowd, Pilate released Barabbas to them. After he had Jesus flogged, he handed him over to be crucified.
- P: The Word of the Lord.
- All: Thanks be to God.

- <sup>33</sup> Pilate went back into the Praetorium and summoned Jesus. He asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?"
- <sup>34</sup> Jesus answered, "Are you saying this on your own, or did others tell you about me?"
- <sup>35</sup> Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? Your own people and chief priests handed you over to me. What have you done?"
- <sup>36</sup> Jesus replied, "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would fight so that I would not be handed over to the Jews. But now my kingdom is not from here."
- <sup>37</sup> "You are a king then?" Pilate asked.

Jesus answered, "I am, as you say, a king. For this reason I was born, and for this reason I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

<sup>38</sup> "What is truth?" Pilate said to him.

After he said this, he went out again to the Jews and told them, "I find no basis for a charge against him. <sup>39</sup> But you have a custom that I release one prisoner to you at the Passover. So do you want me to release the King of the Jews for you?" <sup>40</sup> Then they shouted back, "Not this man, but Barabbas!" (Now Barabbas was a rebel.)


