Sermon Series: DeConstruction or Construction? (3)

TEXT for Today:

Isaiah 6:1-6

1 In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up, and the train of His robe filled the temple. 2 Above it stood seraphim; each one had six wings: with two he covered his face, with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. 3 And one cried to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory!" 4 And the posts of the door were shaken by the voice of him who cried out, and the house was filled with smoke. 5 So I said: "Woe is me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, The Lord of hosts." 6 Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a live coal which he had taken with the tongs from the altar. 7 And he touched my mouth with it, and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; Your iniquity is taken away, And your sin purged." 8 Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying: "Whom shall I send, And who will go for Us?" Then I said, "Here am I! Send me."

The meaning of DeConstruction:

Deconstruction is the process of questioning, doubting, and ultimately rejecting aspects of the Christian faith.

Understand:

Capacity: Meaning the maximum amount something can contain.

We all have a capacity.

24 hours a day.

Something fills our schedule.

Something fills our mind.

Something fills our heart.

CONSIDER THIS:

a. Romans 12:3 For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed (measured) to each of you.

b. John 1:14,16 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth. 16 And of His fullness we have all received, and grace for grace.

CONSIDER THIS:

WHAT DO WE LEARN FROM ISAIAH'S EXPERIENCE?

1. In Chapters 1-5, Isaiah's vision was on what was \_\_\_\_\_ with \_\_\_\_\_ else.

a. Isaiah 1:2 (From the vision God gave Isaiah concerning Judah) Hear, O heavens, and give ear, O earth! For the Lord has spoken: "I have nourished and brought up children, and they have rebelled against Me;

b. Galatians 6:1 Brothers and sisters, if someone is caught in a sin, you who live by the Spirit should restore that person gently. But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted.

c. Matthew 7:1-4 "Do not judge others, and you will not be judged. 2 For you will be treated as you treat others. The standard you use in judging is the standard by which you will be

judged. 3 “And why worry about a speck in your friend’s eye when you have a log in your own?  
4 How can you think of saying to your friend, ‘Let me help you get rid of that speck in your eye,’  
when you can’t see past the log in your own eye?”

b. 1 Peter 1:15-16 But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; 16 for it is written: “Be holy, because I am holy.” (Leviticus 11:44)

Point 2 continued:

g. Ephesians 3:16-20 That He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might through His Spirit in the inner man, 17 that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, being rooted and grounded in love, 18 may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height— 19 to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. 20 Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us,

h. Revelation 5:6a, 7-9 And I looked, and behold, in the midst of the throne and of the four living creatures, and in the midst of the elders, stood a Lamb as though it had been slain... 7 Then He came and took the scroll out of the right hand of Him who sat on the throne. 8 Now when He had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each having a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. 9 And they sang a new song, saying: "You are worthy to take the scroll, and to open its seals; For You were slain, and have redeemed us to God by Your blood..."

Conclusion:

Have you really experienced God's holiness?

God is HOLY!

Press into worship so you catch a glimpse of His holiness!

Reflection:

If we use our mental strength to fight doubt, unbelief, and the interference of the world, we will become tired and a huge target for the attack of the enemy.

Use all your strength (mental, physical, and spiritual) to read and study God's Word, pray and worship. This will fill your entire being with God's holiness and you will stand strong in your faith!
