Perfect Love Casts Out Fear - 1 John 4:16-19 (VFC 01/21/2024)

Seven Assurances of God's Love (vv. 7-21)

- 1. God is love (vv. 7, 8)
 - a. God is spirit (John 4:24) and we must worship Him in spirit and truth.
 - b. God is light (1 John 1:5) and in Him is no darkness at all.
- 2. The Cross of Christ (vv. 9, 10) "In this the love of God was manifested in us..."
 - a. That we might live *through* Christ. Not only do we live through Christ but *for* Him (2 Corinthians 5:15) and *with* Him (1 Thessalonians 5:9, 10).
 - b. That Christ would be the propitiation for our sins.
- 3. Christian's love for each other (vv. 11, 12; 20, 21)

Verse 11 "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also <u>ought</u> to love one another." Verse 21 "whoever loves God <u>must</u> also love his brother."

- 4. The witness of the Holy Spirit (v. 13) "By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit."
- 5. The testimony of the Apostles (v. 14) "And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world."
 - a. Paul (Acts 26:12-20)
 - b. Peter (2 Peter 1:16-21)
- 6. Our personal acknowledgement of Jesus as God's Son (v. 15) "Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God."
- 7. Because He first loved us (vv. 16-19)

When we fully embrace just how much God loves us, we will:

- Seek to abide in Him and have His love abide in us (v.16).
- Realize that we are His ambassadors, and our mission is to preach the message of reconciliation between God and man (v. 17).
- Have no fear of the future judgment because we have matured (perfected) to the point that we no longer are susceptible to the devil's lies about our future. (v.18).
- We love because He first loved us. He initiated this relationship with no guarantee that we would respond (v. 19).

Epilogue: Warren Wiersbe writes, "A man standing in the greeting card section of a store was having trouble picking out a card. The clerk asked if she could help, and he said, 'Well, it's our fortieth wedding anniversary, but I can't find a card that says what I want to say. You know, forty years ago it wouldn't have been any problem picking out a card, because, back then, I didn't know what love is. But we love each other so more today, I just can't find a card that says it.' This is a growing Christian's experience with God ... as he shares the Father's love with others, he experiences more of the Father's love himself."
