Explanation of the Service of Darkness

The service is patterned after the ancient office of Tenebrae. The word "Tenebrae" means "darkness." The purpose of the service is to impress upon us the terrible reality of sin, which caused our Savior to have to die for us, as well as the wonders of our Savior's great love, which led Him to willingly die for us.

A total of eight candles are used. Seven of these candles represent the seven last sentences which our Lord spoke from the cross. The eighth is the Christ Candle, representing Christ's eternal presence with us. He is the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End.

As the seven candles are extinguished, causing the chancel to become darker, we are reminded of the darkness that covered the earth at the time that Jesus said these last words. It also reminds us of the spiritual darkness that would have existed had the "Light of the World" not come.

The exit of the Christ Candle at the end of the service signifies Christ's death and burial...but note...it is not extinguished...symbolic of the eternal light of God's love. We await Easter morning with eager anticipation.

In this particular service, we are also including excerpts from the ancient passion readings. These readings are a harmony of the passion accounts recorded by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John into one document. Today, these readings are not read in chronological order, but in accordance with the themes of Jesus' seven last words. The ancient passion readings, powerfully remind us of the extent of our Lord's love. He would go to the cross—and die—for us!

(*Indicates when the congregation is to stand.)

(The people turn and face the cross as it is carried from the narthex to the altar. The following versicle and response is said at three stations, the first station when the procession begins.)

<u> 3rd Station:</u>



- Pastor: Come, bless the Lord and beg for His forgiveness, all of you who stand in the House of the Lord.
- People: I confess, O Lord Almighty, before the whole company of heaven, and to my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned exceedingly in thought, word and deed, by my own fault, by my own most grievous fault. Wherefore, I pray You, Almighty God, to have mercy on me, forgive me all of my sins and bring me to everlasting life, through Jesus, my Lord. Amen.
- Pastor: I, as a servant of the Word, and in the stead and by the command of our Lord, Jesus Christ, announce the grace of God unto you and forgive you all of your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Come now, and hear again, of what our forgiveness cost our Lord.










