¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,


²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

EARLY CHURCH (30 - 312 CE)

The early church, was heavily persecuted.



To be a Christ follower (a Christian, which was used as a derogatory term) usually came with heavy costs.

A Christian could expect to be socially outcast, losing their job if employed or losing business if working for themselves.

Being persecuted and martyred was almost guaranteed in the early Church. Yet the Church spread and was effective to the Glory of God!

EARLY CHURCH (30 - 312 CE)

"32 Remember those days in the past when you first learned the truth. You had a hard struggle with many sufferings, but you continued strong. 33 Sometimes you were hurt and attacked before crowds of people, and sometimes you shared with those who were being treated that way. 34 You helped the prisoners. You even had joy when all that you owned was taken from you, because you knew you had something better and more lasting. 35 So do not lose the courage you had in the past, which has a great reward."

- Hebrews 10:32-35 (NCV)

CONSTANTINE (312 - 324 CE)

Constantine is most famous for his "Edict of Milan" in 312 CE, which granted Christians religious freedom in the Roman Empire.

Amid theological debates, Constantine called for the first "Church" council to unify the Church. This was the Council of Nicaea (325 CE). This gave us the Nicene Creed!

Constantine also move the capital from Rome to Byzantium (later named Constantinople, modern day Istanbul).

CONSTANTINE (312 - 324 CE)

While the Edict of Milan granted religious freedom to Christians allowing the faith to be accepted, it also brought a lot of people to the Church... many who were not primarily looking for salvation which caused a lot of problems for the Church.

By moving the capital East, dispute over the head of the Church, Rome or Constantinople began and caused disputes.

EAST & WEST (476 - 1453 CE)

Rome's fall in 476 CE began a division between the "Eastern" church and "Western" church. The Eastern church (Greek) used different rites than the Western (Latin).

The Eastern church is now known as the Eastern Orthodox Church.

The Western church is now known as the Roman Catholic Church.

EAST & WEST (476 - 1453 CE)

In 1054 CE, both the Eastern church and Western church claimed true leadership of the Church and condemned the other.

In 1453, Rome refused to help Constantinople during the Muslim invasion, solidifying the divide which stands to this day.

In 1965, both the Eastern Orthodox and Roman Catholic churches nullified their condemnation of each other.

REFORMATION (16TH CENTURY CE)

The Roman Catholic church had many attempts at reformation, but the tipping points occurred in the 16th century with Martin Luther, Ulrich Zwingli, and John Calvin.

Martin Luther is the most famous of the reformers for challenging the Roman Catholic church's teaching and practice of indulgences.

Indulgences were provided by the Pope and could be "purchased" to shorten time in purgatory and therefore reduce the penalty for sins.

REFORMATION (16TH CENTURY CE)

The Reformation shifted the Church to the three "Solas":

"Sola Fide" - By Faith Alone (Romans 1:17)

"Sola Gratia" - By Grace Alone (Ephesians 2:8)

"Sola Scriptura" - Scripture Alone (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

Today there are three confessions, or major practices, of Christianity:

- Roman Catholic
- Eastern Orthodox
- Protestant

All confess the Apostle's Creed and Nicene Creed and are therefore truly Christian.
