The Kingdom of Heaven part 5 handout

The Kingdom of Heaven is like seeds sown in our hearts

Matthew 13:24 (NKJV)

1. Kingdom power is released through faith in the words of the King.

Matthew 8:5-13 (NKJV)

- A. Jesus marveled at the centurion's faith in His Word.
- **B.** We must read the Bible as words spoken to us by the King of the Kingdom of Heaven. Don't read the Bible like a history book, or story book.
- **C.** The kingdom of Heaven develops in our hearts through a process. A process similar to sowing seed in the ground and cultivating it, until it produces a harvest in our fields.
- **D.** The seed is God's Word that produces faith. The ground is on the inside our hearts, and the field is on the outside our lives in the natural realm.
- **E. The kingdom of heaven comes from the seeds of God's Word**. The seeds must sown, and cultivated daily.
- F. We do that by reading, studying and meditating upon the Word. Joshua 1:6-8 (NKJV)
- G. God has been using His Word to accomplish His will long before the coming of Christ.
- H. Have you ever suffered because of other unbelieving believers?
- I. Have you ever wondered when someone you really admired in the faith fell away from God; "If they couldn't make it, how can I expect to make it?"
- J. Joshua had been going through an identity transformation. Numbers 13:8 & 16 (NKJV)
- K. Moses wanted Joshua to look to God.
- L. Joshua was instructed not just to read God's Word, but to read it expecting to do what it says.
- M. He was programming his mouth to speak from the Word in his heart.
- N. God's Word sown in his heart, visualized through meditation cultivation would direct his steps and make way to his God given destiny.
- O. Notice God wasn't making Joshua prosperous and successful.
- P. God's Word made Joshua a fearless, courageous commander of God's army! Joshua 1:10 (NKJV)
- 2. Stealing the Word stops the Kingdom from coming through you. Matthew 13:18-19 (NKJV)
- A. He does that so He can stop or hinder the Kingdom of heaven from coming into your life. Matthew 13:20-23 (NKJV)

- B. He does that through neglect, misunderstanding, persecution, offenses that can harden areas of our hearts.
- **C.** The enemy does that so that the seed won't grow roots. Too many Christians lack being rooted and grounded in the Word.
- **D. We must build a solid foundation in our hearts first.** That foundation in God's Word includes both the kingly and priestly truths and attributes. **Hebrews 5:9-14 (NKJV)**
- E. It's important to note that this epistle is addressing Jewish believers.
- F. They had become dull of hearing because they "knew the Word."
- G. A solid foundation in God's Word isn't just the Word heard but the Word of full age. Hebrews 6:1-3 (NKJV)
- H. The enemy tries to distract us with day to day cares and selfish pursuits that compete for our attention and resources.
- 3. The harvest of the seed is determined by the condition of your heart.
- A. It's not determined by the condition of the seed, but the condition of the heart.
- B. The return (Thirty, sixty and a one-hundred fold) reflects the condition of the heart. Proverbs 4:20-23 (NKJV)
- **C.** The heart is the place where faith is developed. It's also the place where fear, doubt, unbelief and sin are developed. Romans 10:10 (NKJV)
- D. King David knew the power of putting God's Word in his heart. Psalm 119:9-11 (NKJV)
- **E. Impurities of the heart make us double minded.** We vacillate between right and wrong thinking and choices. **James 4:8 (NKJV)**
- F. Your heart can be easily deceived. Jeremiah 17:9-10 (NKJV) Hebrews 4:12 (NKJV)
- G. If we continue to cultivate God's Word, it will empower us to believe and obey it. Matthew 13:24-29 (NKJV)
- H. While men slept refers to hearing the Word while being inactive, and not cultivating it.
- I. The children of Israel died from heart failure in the wilderness. He.3:7-14J. King David had a near fatal spiritual heart attack. His prayer was that God would create in Him a clean heart. Psalm 51:10-11 (NKJV)
