# Unfiltered: Seeing God Clearly In A World Of Distortion Part 5 ⇒ Seeing What You Can Do



*Much of the time, our problem is not the problem.* Our perspective is the often the real problem: **What We See**. 2 Corinthians 4:8-9, 16-18:

"8 We are hard-pressed on every side, yet not crushed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; 9 persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed — 16 Therefore we do not lose heart. Even though our outward man is perishing, yet the inward man is being renewed day by day. 17 For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory, 18 while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal."

- ✓ Your Self-Confidence Numbers 13,14 Caleb saw God and it resulted in self-confidence.
- ☑ Your God-Confidence I Samuel 17 David saw God and killed Goliath.
- ☑ Your Fear Factor 2 Kings 6:14-18; Matthew 14:22-33 Elisha saw God's angels and had no fear.
- ☑ **Everything** Matthew 9:29 According to what you see, it will be done to you!

# Our Problem Is Not The Problem. Our Problem Is Our Perspective On The Problem:

- Neuroscience Says That At The Moment We Begin To Change Our Perspective, Our Emotional Response

  Changes. Kevin Ochsner (Colombia University): "Our emotional responses ultimately flow out of our perspectives of the world, and if we can shift those perspectives, we shift our emotional responses."
- Where Your Look Goes, Your <u>Limbic System</u> Flows. You can control your <u>limbic system</u>, not by suppressing feelings, but by changing the interpretation that creates the feeling in the first place. Our emotional responses fundamentally flow from our interpretation of the world. Your emotional state is both created and shaped by what we choose to see.
- Your Limitations Are Actually About Where You Look, and So The Limited Life Breaks When We Begin To See What God Has Given Us!

# That is why Paul prayed that we would SEE THINGS DIFFERENTLY in Ephesians 1:15-23:

"15 For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all God's people, 16 I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers. 17 I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. 18 I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know (1) the hope to which he has called you, (2) the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, 19 and (3) his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength 20 he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, 21 far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. 22 And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, 23 which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way."

# 3) You Can Turn Death Into Life...

#### This Chips Away At The Self-Pity Mindset

Ephesians 1:18-22 

"I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know...his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church..."

Dr. Viktor Frankl was an Austrian psychologist who survived the death camps of the Nazis. Frankl made a startling discovery about why some survived the horror, and some didn't:

"He looked at several factors - health, vitality, family structure, intelligence, survival skills. Finally he concluded that none of these factors was primarily responsible. The single most significant factor, he realized, was a sense of future vision - the impelling conviction of those who were to survive that they had a mission to perform, some important work left to do. Survivors of POW camps in Vietnam and elsewhere have reported similar experiences: a compelling, future-oriented vision is the primary force that kept many of them alive."

Viktor Frankl found that everything can be taken from a man but one thing: To choose one's attitude in any given set of circumstances, to choose one's way. You can choose to turn death into life! You Have <u>AGENCY</u>!

# Example of Turning Death Into Life: "Suffering and Faith", Martin Luther King Jr.

Date: April 27, 1960 (He was assassinated on April 4, 1968)

In Honor Of Black History Month, February 2024

"Some of my personal sufferings over the last few years have also served to shape my thinking. I always hesitate to mention these experiences for fear of conveying the wrong impression. A person who constantly calls attention to his trials and sufferings is in danger of developing a martyr complex and of making others feel that he is consciously seeking sympathy. It is possible for one to be self-centered in his self-denial and self-righteous in his self-sacrifice. So I am always reluctant to refer to my personal sacrifices. But I feel somewhat justified in mentioning them in this article because of the influence they have had in shaping my thinking.

Due to my involvement in the struggle for the freedom of my people, I have known very few quiet days in the last few years. I have been arrested five times and put in Alabama jails. My home has been bombed twice. A day seldom passes that my family and I are not the recipients of threats of death. I have been the victim of a near fatal stabbing. So in a real sense I have been battered by the storms of persecution. I must admit that at times I have felt that I could no longer bear such a heavy burden, and have been tempted to retreat to a more quiet and serene life. But every time such a temptation appeared, something came to strengthen and sustain my determination. I have learned now that the Master's burden is light precisely when we take his yoke upon us.

My personal trials have also taught me the value of unmerited suffering. As my sufferings mounted I soon realized that there were two ways that I could respond to my situation: either to react with bitterness or seek to transform the suffering into a creative force. I decided to follow the latter course. Recognizing the necessity for suffering I have tried to make of it a virtue. If only to save myself from bitterness, I have attempted to see my personal ordeals as an opportunity to transform myself and heal the people involved in the tragic situation... I have lived these last few years with the conviction that unearned suffering is redemptive.

There are some who still find the cross a stumbling block, and others consider it foolishness, but I am more convinced than ever before that it is the power of God unto social and individual salvation. So like the Apostle Paul I can now humbly yet proudly say, "I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus." The suffering and agonizing moments through which I have passed over the last few years have also drawn me closer to God. More than ever before I am convinced of the reality of a personal God."
