## THE CYCLE OF FAITH | GENESIS 12:9-13:18 | PASTOR MARK BOFILL | 7/16/2023

I. Retracting Faith (12:9-20) | II. Retracing Faith (13:1-4) | III. Reacting Faith 13: 5-13) | IV. Rewarding Faith (13:14-18)

INTRO: Our lesson last week was about Abram Finding Faith in God as he learned to <a href="Step Out">Step Out</a> into a new land. His faith actions were rewarded when God appeared to him with a promise of the very land that he was standing on! Abram responded by <a href="building altars to worship God">building altars to worship God</a>! — A place of Responding to God and Reverencing God, reveals that we Belong to God! We know this BY FAITH! — Ahh, but Abram's Faith Lessons aren't over. In our text today, we'll learn of THE CYCLE OF FAITH, which somehow activates when <a href="wee fail to trust God in all circumstances">wee fail to trust God in all circumstances</a>. — As we grow in faith, <a href="there will most certainly come a time">the Lord</a> and we're <a href="growing in faith">growing in faith</a> and we're <a href="worshipping our King">worshipping our King</a>, then suddenly...things <a href=""">"Go South,"</a> in Abram's case, literally and ironically!

- **I. RETRACTING FAITH (Gen. 12:9-20)** Christians <u>never plan to retract their faith</u>, but our decisions sometimes lead us away from God's perfect will for our lives. (When we do... incoming!)
  - **1. Abram** <u>Journeyed Southward</u> **(9-10)** Possibly exploring the land, planting trees and making places of worship. But <u>he went just a bit too far though</u>, literally into **EGYPT**, <u>the land of the Coptic's</u>. At this time, **Egypt was strong and was well known for its Worldly Ways** and **Pagan Practices**. Symbolically, we refer to Egypt as a <u>type of the world</u>.
    - The Circumstances: "Severe Famine" caused a trigger in Abram to respond naturally! (No mention of calling on God for direction. We should call upon God for EVERYTHING!) As a result...
  - 2. Abram Encountered FEAR (11-13) This is one of those "Faith Lapse Moments" that Came Upon Abram! Instead of trusting the Lord, Finding Faith in the unknown situation, he allowed FEAR to grip his heart and mind! TBT, He told Sarai to lie about being his wife!
    - **His fear was possibly caused by** <u>warnings or stories</u> of others. Particularly, <u>fear fueled</u> <u>his mind</u> because <u>his wife Sarai was a 65-year-old hottie!</u> (He feared for his life, not hers!)
    - Fear always thinks the worst! Faith always Hopes in God for the Best. This reveals Abram's adolescent faith! We all get the shakes sometimes...but God is still there! If he only knew Solomon's wisdom, (Prov 18:10) The name of the Lord is a strong tower; The righteous run to it and are safe. (We too must learn this! e.g., Shad, Mesh, Abed; King David...)
    - (Psalm 34:4) I sought the Lord, and He heard me, and delivered me from all my fears.
    - But we must remember, **Abram is young in his faith**, **barely <u>finding it</u>**. What happens to him was actually **written for our learning**. (Rom 15:4) "For whatever things were <u>written before were written for our learning</u>, that we <u>through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope</u>. (Does the Word of GOD <u>PRODUCE HOPE IN YOU</u>?)
  - 3. God Still Protected Abram (14-20) Wow... it all came to pass! But God did not give up on Abram for his shortcomings. He knew exactly where he was, as well as the circumstances!
     And God's <u>DIVINE INTERVENTION</u> sustained Abram in this situation... <u>PLAGUING PHARAOH'S</u>
     GREAT HOUSE! God's <u>DIVINE PROTECTION</u> delivered Abram, Sarai, and all that he had...

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WHY? B/C He was developing a man of faith! – (2 Tim 2:13) says, If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself!

- Abram <u>Retracted his faith</u> when he defaulted to his flesh, figuring it all out for himself! Only to protect his own neck! Fear overcame him <u>the very moment he went south!</u> (1 Tim 1:7) For God <u>has not given us a spirit of fear</u>, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.
- In every circumstance, the Cycle of Faith is <u>Conditional</u>. We choose <u>Faith or Fear</u> <u>Faith or Flesh</u> <u>Faithfulness or Faultiness!</u> We are to "walk by faith and not by sight."

INTRO: When we Faulter in our faith, God is always there to help us! BUT WE FEEL DEFEATED! When this takes place...RETRACE YOUR FAITH back to the place where you first met with God?

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- **II. RETRACING FAITH (1-4)** Abram should have never gone down to Egypt, but as he left Egypt, notice the phrase, "He Went <u>UP!</u>" i.e., from the worldly place, to the Negev, which is <u>south of Shechem</u>. Approx. 250 miles. (Stepping away from the world is most certainly a step up!)
  - 1. "He Went WITH" (1-2) Sarai, Lot, much livestock, and riches (a very wealthy man!)
  - 2. "He Went ON" his journey (3) from the south to Bethel! Which means that "He Went BACK!" Imagine how he felt on the 250-mile journey... Defeated, Discouraged, Deflated, Abram was Busted and Disgusted! (This is exactly how we feel as Christians when we disobey God!)
  - **3.** When God reveals that "We're Off-Course," then <u>call upon His name as before!</u> **Go back to Bethel...the House of God, the place where you started,** and **(1 John 1:9)** it! That's right... **(tt. Rev 2:5)** it! (i.e. Confess it and 3 R it!)
- P/A This is how you do it church... RETRACE -> RETURN -> REPEAT! When you are faithful to do this, it RESETS YOU on to the next step in the Cycle of Faith! A Cycle that pleases God...
- III. REACTING BY FAITH (5-13) Great...Abram is back on tract! But oh, church...here we learn that many times, our faith will be tested again by those closest to us... OUR FAIMILY!
  - 1. Conflict Arises (5-8) Growth and Prosperity can be great, but they can also cause Problems! You know... the kind that "Invades your Space", the kind that "Rubs you Wrong!" In this case, the land was too small for Abram and Lot's livestock, so STRIFE arose. Amongst their herdsman... i.e., Friction, Contention, Arguing, Disputing, or Fighting.
    - **a.** <u>Notice Abram's REACTION</u> to the matter, *it was rooted in humility*. He <u>Reacted not as the greater</u>, **but with grace**. (*This is what the Cycle of Faith produces!*)
    - **b.** Abram was **first to initiate resolve** for a few reasons:
    - First, their fighting in the field was witnessed by the Canaanites and Perizzites (7). God's people are to be known for their Love, not for their Strife! (John 13:34-35).
    - Secondly, <u>Abram knew that family relationships were far more important that possessions!</u> (Satan, the deceiver often tempts us to hate our brother! cf. 1 Cor 6:7)

- 2. Abram let Lot have the best of the land (9-11) Abram's response reveals some helpful practices when dealing with conflict or strife In Wisdom, he did not blame lot for anything! (Whereas Lot, who gained his possessions by dwelling with Abram should have respected his uncle) That's okay...Abram covered it with love! In Faith, he allowed Lot (the younger) to choose his own land. (Rom 12:18) says, "If it is possible, as much as depends on you, leave peaceably with all men." (especially your family UNITY is more important than your rights. (Matt 5:9) Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.)
  - a. In (v.9) we're told that Abram's choice for land was based on FATE. In (v.10) we're told that Lot's choice was based on sight! (the lust of the eyes!). Lot lifted his eyes, but not high enough! (When making decisions in life, we should always look to the Lord for His perfect will!)
  - **b.** We will learn in chapter 19 that Lot's Faithless Choice will end up in smoke! Sodom and Gomorrah would become a lesson

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- 3. Faith Let's God Choose What's Best (12-13) Abram's trusted God to provide the best land for him! (2 Cor 5:7) tells us that we are to... "Walk by faith, not by sight!"
  - Lot's heart was centered on wealth and worldly achievement, while Abraham wanted only to please the Lord. "Can two walk together, except they be agreed?" (Amos 3:3)

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IV. REWARDING FAITH (14-18) – Notice that <u>Abram didn't demand his portion of land!</u>
But <u>as soon as he separated himself</u> from Lot, he was immediately spoken to by God. – God knew that **Abram Reacted in Faith** as <u>he allowed Lot to choose</u> his land first. God also knew that **Abram Trusted his Fate** <u>to the land</u> that God would choose!

When you give God a "blank check" to do whatever He desires for you, be assured that God will reward your Faith in Him!

- **1.** God told Abram to Look Outward: N, S, E, and W (14) A visual confirmation for Abram.
- **2.** In **(v.15-16)**, <u>God Reaffirmed His Covenant Promise</u> from earlier **(Gen 12:1-3)**. "I will make your descendant as the dust of the earth..." (God's multiplication scale!)
- **3.** God shifts Abram from "Lift Up Your Eyes and Look" in (14), to "Lift up your feet and walk" in (17),... followed by the phrase, "I give it to you." (i.e 'Here's the keys Abram!')
  - His inheritance was <u>later claimed by his descendants</u>, who also responded in faith! (Josh. 1:1–3; <u>Deut. 11:24a</u>) "Every place on which the sole of your foot treats shall be yours..."
- **4.** The Cycle of Faith Completed (18) Abram moved his tent in the right direction! Not far from where he was, to the Terebinth Trees of Mamre, in Hebron, 19 miles SW of Jerusalem.
  - I love this! Mamre = Strength or Fatness, and Hebron = Communion. By faith, Abram dwelt in a place where he would be strengthened... a place where abundant overflow would continue in his life as he remained in Communion with God! (Where do you dwell?)
