LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON | GENESIS 26 | PASTOR MARK BOFILL | 12/03/2023

* I. <u>Wandering</u> (1-5) | II. <u>Wife</u> (6-11) | III. <u>Wealth</u> (12-16) | IV. <u>Wells</u> (17-22) | V. <u>Worship</u> (23-25) | VI. <u>Witness</u> (25-33) | VI. <u>Woes</u> (34-35)

INTRO: As we get into the second half of the Book of Genesis, I want to remind you that Genesis is A Book of Genealogies: Of the Heavens and the Earth (2-4), of Adam (5-6:8); of Noah (6:9-9:29), of Shem, Ham, & Japheth (10-11:9), and in (11:10-25:11) it lists Terah, who was the father of ABRAHAM, who became the Father of Faith. Briefly mentioned next is Ishmael's genealogy (25:12-18), then the last three: ISAAC (25:19-35:29), Esau (36-37:1) and finally of JACOB (37:2-50:26).

- Today we are going to ZERO IN on ISAAC, because he became God's new focus, (Gen 25:11)
 "After the death of Abraham, God blessed his son Isaac. And Isaac dwelt at Beer Lahai Roi."—
 God's promises to Abraham would NOW be upheld through Isaac!
- In this chapter we will learn that <u>Isaac's 'Faith</u>, <u>Circumstances</u>, and <u>Actions</u> are comparable his fathers in many ways So, I've entitled this sermon LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON (Genesis 26:1-35)*
- I. The <u>WANDERING</u> Of Isaac (1-5) Like his father, Isaac <u>WANDERED</u> away from the place of <u>blessing</u> to go to Egypt. (Gen 12:10) tells us that <u>in the early stages of Abraham's faith</u> a <u>SEVERE</u> FAMINE was the land of Canaan, <u>which caused him to flee to Egypt.</u> Now, under similar circumstances (1a), <u>ISAAC faces a FAMINE</u>, and is <u>TESTED</u> to see if he would <u>OBEY God's voice</u> also.
 - A. His Course (1b) Isaac was heading for Egypt, but he traveled first to GERAR, a city which bordered Egypt (Philistine Territory). There we are told that he "Went to ABIMILECH," a dynastic title for the King of the Philistines. (A different ruler than in Abraham's time (20-21), more likely his son)
 - Notice that, as he went... "Then" the Lord appeared to him!
 - B. His Course Correction (2-3a) Because Isaac was the seed bearer, God directly warned him NOT to "Go Down" to Egypt but allowed him to remain in Gerar. God's counsel was for Isaac to, "Dwell in this land, and I will be with you." i.e., STAY PUT! If he would remain in Gerar, God promised to bless him! (Psalm 37:3) Trust in the Lord, and do good; Dwell in the land, and feed on His faithfulness. (This is the test! Don't wander!) God then took the moment to provide Isaac with...
 - C. His Covenant Reminder (3b–5) The OATH that He swore to Abraham in (22:16–18), which contained the promise of Land, the promise of the Seed, and the promise of Blessings is repeated here, because Isaac was the heir to the promises God made to Abraham. Though it was an unconditional covenant, Isaac was still to OBEY God's voice as his father did! Keep the charge!
- P/A Trials and Hardships will often happen in life! But where do you go! When Life gets rough, ARE YOU A WANDERER? When there is a 'famine in our souls,' do we walk with God by faith or Wander towards Egypt! Only those who are faithful to listen to God and obey His voice will have the promise of God's blessings!
- II. The <u>WIFE</u> Of Isaac (6-11) Like his father Abraham, now <u>Isaac LIES about his wife</u>! As Isaac agreed to <u>dwell in the land</u>, eventual testing's came also! Because **Rebekah** was "beautiful to behold," the men of Gerar asked about her availability.
 - A. His Cowardice (6–7) Isaac now makes the same <u>dishonest claim</u> that Abraham used in both <u>Egypt</u> (12:10–12) and <u>Gerar</u> (20:1–18). He reported that Rebekah was his sister! We are also told that <u>he did it to save his own neck!</u> He lied because he was AFRAID! (absence of faith and focus on God!)

- Earlier in life Isaac had the faith to believe in God for children (25:21), but NOW he fails to believe in God for protection! Instead of laying down HIS LIFE for his wife (Eph 5:25), he laid down a LIE! "Husband, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the Church and gave Himself for her."
- **B.** His Carelessness (8-9) After some time, Abimelech saw Isaac showing endearment to Rebekah. The Hebrew verb implies they were laughing while caressing affectionately. Abimelech then called him out on his lie! (God's people are to be a <u>Witness</u> to unbelievers, not <u>Stumbling blocks!</u>)
- C. His Criticism (10-11) WOW... a pagan king acts more honorably than a son of God! (Prov 29:12) says, If a ruler pays attention to lies, All his servants become wicked. Abimelech, wanted to protect his people from guilt, so he imposed a death penalty on any who touch Isaac and Rebekah! As with Abraham, this was God's divine protection at work (tt. Psalm 105:7-15)
- P/A Like Father Like Son... If God is our Father, then we should never Lie because God never lies! God made a NT example of Ananias and Saphira, two of God's children who allowed falsehood in their report of giving. "Why have you conceived this thing in your heart? You have not lied to men but to God."
- III. The <u>WEALTH</u> Of Isaac (12-16) Like his father, God blessed Isaac with wealth and favor! After the king's rebuke, Isaac settled in the land and Began Farming. As he did so, God MULTIPLIED the work of his hands. We are told that Isaac became 'Very Prosperous' (13-14a), but the Philistines 'Envied Him' (14b) This is a good and bad report! GOOD, because it testified to God's favor when abiding in Him... BAD, because his enemies coveted his prosperity and became hostile towards Isaac!
 - A. His Conflict (15) Because they did not want Isaac to prosper, his enemy stopped up his wells! Water was essential for survival in the desert and Isaac had it! They literally filled his life source with dirt! This is exactly what Satan tries to do to God's children! Our Spiritual Life Source is Jesus Christ... He is the Well of Living Water from which we are to rely upon! In (John 7:38) Jesus said... "He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water"
 - B. His Casting Out (16) Isaac's wealth and prosperity was so abundant, that Abimelech was threatened by his MIGHT! If God is mighty, then God's children should be mighty! In (Jug 6:12) the Angel told Gideon, "The Lord is with you, you mighty man of valor!" As children of God, we are to BE MIGHTY...but some of us just don't know it! In fact, the enemy can't handle a mighty son or daughter of God! Their only resolve, "Go away from us!"
- **P/A** When you do well... **know that there will be others who envy you!** Be wise in your dealings! Isaac could have retaliated for their actions, but **he kept his peace and moved on!**
- IV. The <u>WELLS</u> Of Isaac (17-22) Like his father Abraham, Isaac had to Keep Digging! There is more to a well than just water... A well is a symbol of a thriving community! And the Philistines did not want the communities God's people to thrive! Nevertheless, Isaac kept on...
 - A. His Continuance (17-18) <u>Isaac relocates</u> from the <u>City of Gerar</u> to the Valley of Gerar, a region under the control of Gerar, but not next to it. There, <u>Isaac "Dug Again!"</u> He KNEW approximately <u>where his Father's wells were</u>, so he continued to search for them... <u>Like Father, Like Son!</u>
 - When Isaac found them, notice that he DID NOT rename them... He <u>called them what his</u> father did! Why, because <u>valuable lessons</u> are attached to their names. In fact...

- God wanted ISAAC to look for these wells so he could experience the same lessons that Abraham did! – In the next paragraph, those names and there meaning are rediscovered...
- B. His Contention (19–22) Isaac's men kept digging in the valley, but here we are told the well was of RUNNING WATER (19) The {Heb. word Hai, khah-ee; lit. Living or Alive, Springing or Fresh} I found this to be fascinating! This is a living well that was not only Physically Refreshing, but also Life-Sustaining! (Running water is needed.. not stagnant water!)
 - 1. In John chapter 4, Jesus had an encounter with a Samaritan woman at a well. They talked about physical thirst and the need to Draw Water from Jacob's Well. But Jesus changed the conversation from the Physical to the SPIRITUAL realm. He said, "Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, 14 but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life." (John 4:13-14) She replied... Sir...give me this water! (b/c she was Spiritually Drained!)
 - 2. In (v.20) we see that <u>contention escalated</u> over this well as the Herdsman of Gerar claimed that the "WATER WAS THERES!" Such contention was troubling to Isaac, so he left the well to them and <u>called it ESEK.</u> As they <u>dug another well</u> (21), <u>they quarreled over it also</u>, so <u>Isaac named it SITNAH.</u> As <u>Isaac moved to a third site</u> (22), they dug again and <u>there was NOT a dispute</u>, so he named the well REHOBOTH. The names of these wells reflect the events associated with them:
 - ESEK Quarrel (20) Our enemy always seeks to steal our water!
 - SITNAH Enmity (21) Our enemy HATES US and wants to quench us and Harass us!
 - REHOBOTH Spaciousness (22) As we walk through life, we... in a sense we are digging wells. Trying to find that place of settling! Room Enough where we can plant and grow in peace and prosperity. As we do so, we should always be seeking the Lord's direction, even as Isaac found (22b)... "Now the Lord has made room for us, and we shall be fruitful in the land." (God will faithfully supply your every need, 'IF' you thirst for upon Him).

P/A – Have you found your well? Maybe you "have not," because you "ask not!" Maybe you "have not" because of a CERTAIN SIN in your life! Whatever the case, you can Call Upon the Lord today, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord! (Acts 3:19) But be truthful though!

V. The <u>WORSHIP</u> Of Isaac (23-25) – Like his father Abraham, Isaac LEARNED to call on the name of the Lord. From Gerar, <u>Isaac traveled 20 miles southeast</u> to BEERSHEBA, a place where his father dwelt for some time. <u>Years earlier</u>, <u>Abraham dug a well there and made an OATH with Abimelech</u>, giving him <u>seven ewe lambs</u> as a witness (21:25-32). – At this location <u>Abraham planted a Tamarisk Tree also</u> (21:33) and <u>he called on the name JEHOVAH...</u> the EVERLASTING GOD: <u>EL OLAM</u>.

- NOW God Appears to Isaac once more, telling him "NOT TO FEAR," He said, "...For I AM WITH YOU." He then REAFFIRMS the Blessing to "His descendants!" (Reassurance was needed!)
- So then, Isaac <u>RESPONDS with WORSHIP</u>, building an ALTAR there and he also "called upon the name of JEHOVAH."

P/A – On many occasions <u>Abraham built altars and worshipped God as prescribed</u>. Isaac must have learned from his father that God has a prescribed a right WAY to worship God! – Jesus clarified this also to the Samaritan woman at the well...

"But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. ²⁴ God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." (John 4:23-24) – Is your worship of God Spiritual and truthful?

VI. The <u>WITNESS</u> Of Isaac (26-33) – Like his father Abraham, Isaac made an Oath of Peace. When Isaac <u>walked</u> in <u>disobedience</u> he brought trouble on others, when he <u>walked</u> in <u>obedience</u>, he brought blessing on others, and he found his place! He let God deal with his enemies...

- A. His Covenant (26–31) Abimelech comes to Isaac to establish a covenant (v. 28). He wanted to assure they will live together peacefully (21:22–32). Phicol is possibly the same individual as in (21:22), but the <u>name could also be a family name or a title</u>. But who is who is AHUZZATH? His name means "Possession." Is it <u>possible that Ahuzzath</u> also dwelt in the valley where Isaac <u>pitched his tent</u>? Did Abimelech bring the commander of his army is case of war?
- This is all speculation, but <u>I know this</u>: God can make even your enemies to want peace with you! (All too often our flesh jumps into defense, feeling the need to retaliate when wronged **Leave it to God!**)
- B. His Confirmation (32–33) Just as they departed in peace, Isaac got favorable news from his men which served as a direct confirmation from God! They found the well at SHEBA, the very well that his Father claimed and made peace with the Abimelech of his day! Wow! Coincidence? NO... It was a divine lesson from God and Isaac acknowledged Him by calling it by it's proper name...Beersheba, which resembles the Hebrew word for "oath." Beersheba (cf. 21:31)

P/A – Is there an Abimelech in your life? **Just pray for them!** – Jesus instructed... "I say to you who hear: **Love your enemies**, do good to **those who** hate **you** (Luke 6:27) – If you keep "digging in life," your life will impact those around you!

VII. The <u>WOES</u> Of Isaac (34-35) – Like his father Abraham, ISAAC was grieved for his firstborn son. As Abraham <u>had a wayward son</u>; Ishmael, who broke his heart; <u>now Isaac has a</u> WAYWARD SON, Esau.

- **His Concern (34–35)** Esau <u>acted ungodly</u> and <u>chose two wives poorly</u>, **almost to spite his parents.** His actions deliberately ignored the standard set by Abraham for Isaac.
- This is confirmed as they made life bitter for Isaac and Rebekah.
- As wonderful it is to have children, sometimes they can be the source of our woes!

CLOSING THOUGHTS: This was Isaac's life! Both he and his father made a lot of mistakes, but God still saw them as His children! There is no perfect earthly father and there is no perfect earthly son! But The ultimate 'LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON' example is FOUND in Jesus Christ, who delighted to follow His Father's footsteps. (John 5:19) "Most assuredly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, but what He sees the Father do; for whatever He does, the Son also does in like manner.
