MATTERS OF IMPORTANCE | GENESIS 46:1-30 | PASTOR MARK BOFILL | 6/9/2024

*I. Important Rest Stop (1-4) | II. Important Records (5-27) | III. Important Reunion (28-30)

INTRO: In our last study (ch.45), we learned of God's Prevailing Promises, where <u>Joseph</u> 'Revealed Himself' to his brothers. We learned that when God is in charge, <u>everything comes</u> together for the greatest good; and that Forgiveness and Reconciliation are important parts of every relationship. — As we continue the story of Israel, Genesis 46, reveals three additional MATTERS OF IMPORTANCE for Jacob and his entire family. *

CONTEXT: When Jacob was told that <u>Joseph was ALIVE</u> **(45:28),** he immediately rose to make his way to Egypt to "see Joseph before he died." But first...

- I. IMPORTANT <u>REST STOP</u> (1-4) As Israel left the <u>Promised Land</u>, it would be <u>for the LAST TIME!</u> And because he was <u>journeying into the unknown once again</u>, <u>he needed God's reassurance</u>. So, he went back to the place where he grew up. <u>A familiar place</u> where he had left before to worship the Lord and ask for His help.
- A. Returning To Beersheba (1-2) Rather than darting straight for Egypt, Jacob took the time to Pause at Beersheba (1), "the well of seven-fold oaths." There he WORSHIPPED!
- Beersheba was <u>a special place to Jacob</u>... *a place of spiritual strengthening*. His grandfather Abraham has <u>dug a well</u> there (22:19). God also <u>appeared to Hagar</u> there (22:17) NOW, God <u>appears to ease Israel's concerns</u> about dwelling in Egypt (2a). How so? By *Using a Vision...*
 - He <u>Calls</u> to him: "Jacob, Jacob" (more on this later)
 - He <u>Identifies</u> Himself: as "The God of your father" (Israel knew that God spoke with Isaac)
 - He <u>Calms</u> him "Do not fear to go to Egypt" (He was concerned... protection, provision, prosperity, etc.)
 - He Reassures him "I will make you a great nation there" and "I will go down with you"
 - He Promises his return "to bring him back to Canaan" (b/c it was his family's promised posterity)
 - He Foretells of Comfort at his death "Joseph will put his hand on your eyes"
- Notice in (v.2b) that Israel, positioned himself to receive from God... "Here I am." God desires to lead and guide us likewise: (tt. Psalm 32:7-9)
- B. Reassurance For Egypt (3-4) God evidently knew that Jacob had a fearful reserve in his heart about "Going to Egypt" thus, the double name emphasis! Elsewhere in the Bible we see God repeating the names of His servants, who needed a special word from God: In(Gen 22:11), "Abraham, Abraham;" in (1 Sam 3:10), we learn of young "Samuel, Samuel." Then there is the busy beaver, "Martha, Martha" in (Luke 10:41). Ahh, and we can't forget the former persecutor of the early Christians, "Saul, Saul!" (Acts 9:4); He answered, "Who are You, Lord?"
- P/A Israel knew the IMPORTANCE of A REST STOP! In the busyness of our lives, we too should take the time to PAUSE, PRAY, & WORSHIP when facing new ventures! When we do, we set ourselves up to hear a Word from our Heavenly Father. LISTEN for HIM, so that He doesn't have to speak your name 2x's!

The Second Matter of Importance Pertains to...

- II. IMPORTANT <u>RECORDS</u> (5-27) This section of scripture is <u>significant</u> because it serves as a **Genealogical Registry for Israel**, before entering Egypt.
- **A.** Jacob's Entourage (5-7) Jacob <u>left Beersheba</u>, ready for whatever happens next because he knew that God was with him. On their Journey it says that, "his sons carried their father Jacob, their <u>little ones</u>, and their <u>wives</u>." (5a-c).
 - **1.** They did so in the carts which Pharaoh had sent to carry him (5d) (An easier trip)
 - 2. They took ALL their belonging with them (6a-c)
 - **3.** Jacob and ALL <u>his descendants</u> with him, *his sons* and *his sons' sons, his daughters* and *his sons' daughters*, to Egypt **(6d-7)** Which speaks of commitment to the move! (All IN!)

CONTEXT: Now **these were the names** of the children of Israel, Jacob and his sons who went to Egypt **(8a)** – The lists that follow are ordered first by Jacob's wives, then by the sons each bore.

- B. Jacob's Sons from <u>LEAH</u> (8b-15) First mentioned are <u>The Sons of Leah</u>, whom she bore to Jacob in Padan Aram, (15) This list is not chronological, but arranged by birth order from Leah <u>She began with the Reuben</u> who was Jacob's firstborn (8b).
 - The sons of ¹Reuben: Hanoch, Pallu, Hezron, and Carmi (9)
 - The sons of ²Simeon: Jemuel, Jamin, Ohad, Jachin, Zohar, and <u>Shaul</u>, the son of a Canaanite woman (10) Not desirable, but still permitted by God and named in the record (seed)
 - The sons of ³Levi: Gershon, Kohath, and Merari (11) Tribes used for the service of the tabernacle
 - The sons of ⁴<u>Judah</u>: Er, Onan, Shelah, Perez, and Zerah (<u>Er</u> and <u>Onan</u> <u>died in Canaan</u>). The sons of <u>Perez</u> were ^{GGS}Hezron and ^{GGS}Hamul (12) The Messianic seed would stem from Judah)
 - The sons of ⁹Issachar: Tola, Puvah, Job, and Shimron (13) And Leah thought she was done!
 - The sons of ¹⁰Zebulun: Sered, Elon, and Jahleel (14)
- Worth noting is that even though <u>Leah was seemingly less loved</u> by Jacob, it is well <u>recorded</u> in the history of Israel, that LEAH, the unwanted wife, actually became the primary Matriarch of Israel. She definitely became <u>the most fruitful</u>...

Census: 6 Sons, 25 Grandsons, and 2 Great Grandsons and 1 Daughter. All the persons from Jacob and Leah, his sons and including (Dinah), were Thirty-Three (15)

C. Jacob's Sons from <u>ZILPAH</u> (16-18) – She had two sons, which were <u>Gad</u> and <u>Asher</u>. (Technically, <u>these were also considered Leah's sons</u>, **born during her** <u>birth competition</u> with Rachael!)

- The sons of ⁷Gad: Ziphion, Haggi, Shuni, Ezbon, Eri, Arodi, and Areli. (16)
- The sons of ⁸Asher: Jimnah, Ishuah, Isui, <u>Beriah</u>, and ^{GD}Serah, <u>their sister</u>. And the <u>sons of</u> <u>Beriah</u> were ^{GS}<u>Heber</u> and ^{GS}<u>Malchiel</u> (17)

Census: These were the sons of **Zilpah**, the *maidservant of Leah*, whom **Laban** gave to his daughter. 2 Sons, 11 Grandsons, and 2 Great Grandsons and 1 Grand Daughter. The <u>total</u> record Zilpah bore to Jacob before entering Egypt was **Sixteen persons (18).**

D. Jacob's Sons from RACHEL (19-22) – RACHEL WAS HIS BELOVED WIFE; she bore two sons to Jacob: Joseph and Benjamin (19). But Rachel died in labor with Benjamin! (35:16-20)

- The sons of ¹¹Joseph, who were <u>born in the land of Egypt</u> were <u>Manasseh</u> and <u>Ephraim</u>. Also mentioned is the name of their Egyptian mother, <u>Asenath</u> (20)
- The sons of ¹²Benjamin: Belah, Becher, Ashbel, Gera, Naaman, Ehi, Rosh, Muppim, Huppim, and Ard (22)

Census: 2 Sons, and 12 Grandsons. These were the sons of Rachel (23), who were born to Jacob: Fourteen persons in all.

E. Jacob's Sons from BILHAH (23-25) - Bilhah was the maidservant of Rachel (Gen 30:1-8).

- The son of ⁵Dan: Hushim (24) (Joke: <u>It seems</u>, he was a rather <u>quite</u> man who <u>dwelt alone</u>...ha!)
- The sons of ⁶Naphtali: Jahzeel, Guni, Jezer, and Shillem (25)

Census: 2 Sons, and 5 Grandsons. – These were the sons of Bilhah, whom Laban gave to Rachel his daughter, and she bore these to Jacob: Seven persons in all (26a)

A Confirmation of FAMILY Records (26-27) – All the persons who went with Jacob to Egypt, who came from his body, besides Jacob's sons' wives, were <u>Sixty-Six</u> persons in all (26b); and the sons of Joseph who were born to him in Egypt were two persons.

- The inclusion of <u>Jacob and Joseph</u> would <u>Total Seventy</u>, from Jacob's house who went to Egypt (27) The <u>testimony of Scripture is 70 persons</u>, also confirmed (Ex. 1:5) and (<u>Deut 10:22</u>), where <u>Moses declares</u>, "Your fathers went down to Egypt with seventy persons, and now the Lord your <u>God has made you as the stars of heaven in multitude</u>."
- <u>Vs. 15</u> = **33**, <u>Vs. 18</u> = **16**, <u>Vs. 22</u> = **14**, <u>Vs. 25</u> = **7**, a **TOTAL** of **70**.
- In (Acts 7:14) Stephen mentions 75 people, because he was referring to the LXX, which includes the three sons of Ephraim and two sons of Manasseh (cf. Num 26:28-37)
- The NUMBER 70 is <u>used much in scripture</u> beginning with: The list of <u>70 Nations</u> (Gen 10). In (Num 11:16) it lists the <u>70 Elders</u>, and in (Dan 9:24), we read of the <u>70 Weeks</u> <u>Prophecy</u>. Even in the NT we learn that there were the <u>70 Members of the Sanhedrin</u>.

CLOSING THOUGHTS: I know this all may seem rather boring to learn about, however **These IMPORTANT RECORDS** serve God's purposes re: **ISRAEL'S EXISTENCE**: Past, Present, and Future!

In His infinite wisdom, God knows how to keep track of Important Records!
The tribes of Israel are listed in (Rev 7:5-8,) but they are not the same tribes as listed here, or even in Joshua.

God cares about their existence, just like He cares about our existence. YOU MATTER TO GOD!

- He <u>MADE YOU</u> and He <u>KNOWS YOU!</u> - We see this communicated when God told Jeremiah, "Before <u>I formed you</u> in the womb <u>I KNEW YOU</u>; <u>Before you were born</u>, <u>I SANCTIFIED YOU</u>; <u>I ordained you</u> a prophet to the nations." (Jer 1:5)

Our Final Matter of Importance Involves an...

III. IMPORTANT REUNION (28-30) — Here we have **another emotional event in Joseph's life**, the long-awaited <u>reunion</u> of <u>Joseph</u> and <u>his</u> father <u>Jacob</u></u>. **Both** have waited for so long...

A. Drawing Near Goshen (28-29a) – As Jacob drew near, he sent Judah ahead to meet Joseph and obtain directions to the Goshen area (28) – He probably sent Judah because he exhibited a true spirit of repentance and change of heart among Joseph's brothers. (They arrived at Goshen)

- In (v.29a) we see that Joseph prepares to meet his father, Israel. Can you imagine his excitement? "I get to see my dad! I love my dad, I miss my dad, I want to tell my dad what God has done in my life!" (Personally, I can identify with that thought! My dad passed-on Feb. 7th, 2002, which makes it 22 years since I've seen him!) Furthermore, even King David expressed this same also kind of excitement and expectation... but to SEE HIS HEAVENLY FATHER, (Psalm 17:15) As for me, I will see Your face in righteousness; I shall be satisfied when I awake in Your likeness. (Is this your hope and desire?)
- And so, we see both Jacob and Joseph <u>Drawing Near</u> to each other for their Important Reunion – Ironically, I researched the meaning of GOSHEN, it literally means "<u>Drawing</u> <u>Near</u>." Both are drawing near each other to meet in a safe place!
- Goshen would later become a place of Separation and Protection from the plagues of Egypt (Ex 8:22; 9:26), and a Place of Light, when darkness consumed Egypt (Ex 10:23).

P/A – Do you have a Goshen in your life? A place where you "draw near to God." – CHURCH!

- **B.** Delightful Reacquaintance (29b-30) Joseph "presented himself" to his father ALIVE! This reunion of Israel with Joseph was more than he ever before dreamed. He had heard the news that his favored son lived, and now he was able to embrace him in person!
 - The <u>delight of seeing your loved one</u> that you thought was dead, actually standing before you would bring "elation" and of course "tears" of joy, as it did for them!
 - *Israel's comment* meant that <u>he could now die a happy man!</u> Yet, he would live in Egypt for <u>another 17 years</u> (Gen 47:28)

P/A – *God is a God of Restoration!* He understands reunions very well. – He also delights in **MENDING BROKEN FAMILIES!** – *But it all starts with Drawing Near to Him.* – Because of Jesus Christ, we can "Draw Near to God," our Heavenly Father (Heb 10:22)

• This family reunion is a picture of our **HEAVENLY** family reunion. — **(1 Cor 13:12a)** says, "For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face..."
