* DEALING WITH SINNERS | LUKE 7:36-50 | PASTOR MARK BOFILL | 9/28/2025

I. Actions of a Broken Woman (36-38) | II. Actions of an Unbroken Man (39-43) | III. Actions of a Forgiving Savior (44-50)

INTRO: Last week, we learned of Jesus' Dealings with Doubt. – In today's sermon we will learn How Jesus Perceives and Pardons Sinners. – A contrast of the Repentant and the Rigid as He DEALS WITH SINNERS. *

I. ACTIONS OF A BROKEN WOMAN (36-38) – READ

- **A.** Agreement to Fellowship with a Pharisee (36) The Pharisee, invited Jesus to his home to eat with him (perhaps for curiosity or even scrutiny). Jesus accepted the invitation as an opportunity to minister.
- B. A Sinful Woman Pursues Jesus (37-38) BEHOLD, Luke introduces the third character of this story.
 - 1. Who was this woman? (37a) She was not Mary Magdelene of (Luke 8:2), and not Mary of Bethany (John 11:2, 12:3). I mention this because <u>Jesus' feet were anointed with oil and wiped with a woman's hair on</u> two different occasions. Despite their similarities, the two incidents are sometimes mistaken for one another. This woman is NOT named, but <u>her pursuit of Jesus</u> teaches us much about <u>Brokenness!</u>
 - **a.** She was <u>a woman of the city</u> (a prostitute) A profession that was prone to <u>mistreatment</u>, <u>suffering</u>, and <u>ultimately emptiness</u>, which **resulted in regret and remorse**.
 - b. She was labeled as a **SINNER** amongst the people (everyone knew this about her) At this point in her life, she recognized it to be true. (Rom 3:23) for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.
 - 2. What did this woman do? (37b-38) She KNEW that SHE NEEDED JESUS! (It was time for her to surrender)
 - a. She KNEW that Jesus was at the Pharisees home (she had connections) She pursued Jesus!
 - **b.** She <u>BROUGH</u>T an alabaster flask of fragrant oil (she was resourceful) An expensive gift to honor Jesus.
 - c. She <u>STOOD</u> behind Jesus, at His feet (she was respectful think of the position!) As Jesus reclined on a couch while eating, with His head near the table, she stood at His feet. (How to you approach Jesus?)
 - If you check the harmony of the Gospels, you will discover that just before this event, Jesus had given a gracious invitation to all, "Come unto me...and I will give you rest." (tt. Matt 11:28-30) After much self-examination, I believe that this woman was responding to Christ's invitation!
 - d. She was <u>WEEPING!</u> (as a result of her sin) She knew that she was guilty of the sins of the flesh. She had been carrying the heavy weight of her sin for far too long... <u>causing her to be broken!</u>
 - **e.** She <u>WASHED</u> Jesus' feet with her tears! Figuratively, what does this speak to us? More importantly, what does it say to God when a person is broken like this before His feet?
 - (Psalm 51:17) The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit, a broken and a contrite heart These, God, You will not despise!
 - **f.** She <u>WIPED</u> His feet with her hair Her hair was part of her occupation, used to seduce men.
 - g. She KISSED Jesus' feet! kataphileo, to kiss much, again and again, tenderly. An act of love!
 - **h.** She <u>ANOINTED</u> Jesus feet with very Costly oil! Such worship and sacrifice <u>revealed her conviction</u> that <u>there was nothing too good for Jesus</u>.
- P/A What aroma does your worship send to God's throne? The actions of this sinful woman reveal that she was broken and in need of a Savior! SHE WAS REPENTANT... Nothing else mattered to her at this point! (Psalm 34:18) The LORD is near to those who have a broken heart and Saves Such as have a contrite spirit.

II. ACTIONS OF AN UNBROKEN MAN (39-43) - READ: HOW Jesus KNOWS and DEALS with the Rigid

- A. The Pharisee's Perception (39) His attitude was quite different than the sinful woman! He actually looked upon Jesus' acceptance of this woman with Disdain, Disgust and Disapproval
 - **1.** He Spoke to Himself (murmured <u>in his own heart</u>) <u>He believed that</u> Prophets, like Pharisees, <u>should be separate from sinners</u>... but **DIDN'T SAY IT!** (<u>Shameful things</u> are usually the things that we mutter with our lips!)
 - **2.** His Presumption He reasoned that <u>Jesus must not</u> be *a legitimate prophet* since He allowed this sinful woman to "*Touch Him!*" (bestow such affection).
 - It's comforting to know that **Jesus is Touchable**... even by sinners! (We can always reach out to Him!)
 - **3.** His Judgment of the Woman (He knew that she was a sinner?) Who was the Real Sinner here? This contrast is very similar to that of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. (tt. Luke 18:9-13) Jesus spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others:
- B. Jesus' Perception (40) Christ's omniscience revealed the Pharisee's thoughts.
 - **1. He identifies the Pharisee by name: Simon** (When Dealing with our Sin, Jesus calls us out by name! Impression)
 - 2. He told Simon that He had something to SAY (Not murmur) Jesus is always straightforward and truthful!
 - **3.** He was told to speak on This was actually a commendable thing for Simon to SAY. We should always seek to hear what Jesus has to say on any issue... are you listening? (Don't cut Him off)
- **C. Jesus Provides a Parable (41-43)** A **short relatable story** used to illustrate a deeper spiritual truth.
 - 1. The illustration included a Creditor and Two Debtors (41-42b) Both OWED the creditor money!
 - a. While the <u>value of a denarius</u> **fluctuated**, one Biblical reference to the coin suggests that <u>at the time</u>, it was <u>worth one day's labor</u>, or about \$50 in today's money (Matt 20:2). i.e., \$25,000 & \$2,500
 - **b.** Neither of the debtors <u>could repay</u> their debt (42a) (Think spiritually here! As for you and I for Our Sin)
 - **c.** The Creditor chose to <u>Graciously Forgive</u> the debt of each man (42c) Who does this speak of now?
 - 2. After the illustration, <u>Jesus asked Simon a Question</u> (42c) Who will <u>love</u> the creditor more? (Agapao: verb) This teaches that **debt forgiven** he more we are forgiven, the more we should love!
 - **3.** Simon's Answer (43) His natural answer, "he supposed" that it would be the one who had the greater debt. (it was an easy test!) Jesus then informed him that he judged correctly. But the obvious also applies to Simon. But Simon failed to recognize his own self-righteousness as SIN! –
- P/A Many remain Blind to the plain and simple lessons that Jesus tries to teach. This is what occurs when we are Not Broken!
 - The woman KNEW that the debt that she owed was great; however, Simon did not see the debt that he owed! SPIRITUAL BLINDNESS is a life-threatening condition experienced by those who do not believe in Jesus Christ, and His Word (Rom 2:8; 2 Thess 2:12). Those who reject Christ are LOST (John 6:68-69). Being spiritually blind, they are perishing (2 Cor 4:3-4; Rev 3:17).

Closing Thought: Dr. H. C. Woodèring said so pointedly, "When God cannot get religious leaders to appreciate Christ, He will get harlots to do so." – God can make the rocks cry out, yet some of our hearts this morning have formed into the toughest stone that exists... PRIDE AND BLINDNESS!

III. ACTIONS OF A FORGIVING SAVIOR (44-50) – READ: Jesus compares the actions of each sinner

- **A.** Differences Recognized (44-47) Still speaking to Simon, <u>Jesus turned to the sinful woman</u> and asking if he saw her? He then gave a series of concluding statements, which revealed who had the greater sin!
 - **1.** He Commented on Simon's Hospitality (44) NO WATER was given for Jesus' feet (a common practice of the day). Yet the woman used HER TEARS to wash Jesus' feet!
 - **2.** He Commented on Simon's Greeting (45) NO KISS (again a common practice amid the Jewish culture). Yet the broken sinful woman **DID NOT STOP KISSING** Jesus' feet since she arrived! *kataphileo*
 - 3. He Commented on the <u>Woman's Anointing Oil</u> (46) She APPLIED the FRAGRANT OIL <u>on Jesus' feet</u>, yet Simon FAILED TO ANOINT THE HEAD of Jesus! <u>Understand that both actions gave off an AROMA!</u> **W. Wiersbe** said, "True faith cannot be hidden, true faith shows itself in love and worship"
- **B.** Drawing His Conclusion (47-48) As Jesus evaluated the contrast between the Sinful Woman and the Sinful Pharisee, He revealed who was worthy of His fellowship and forgiveness... the BROKEN Woman!
 - 1. He Said that her Many Sins were Forgiven (47a) He righteously CANCELLED her past debts! (All Debt!)
 - **2.** He Saw that the woman had Much Love (47b) Her GREAT LOVE was PROOF that she had been forgiven, probably personally before and now publicly! But she came to Jesus for the assurance of it!
 - 3. He Provided a <u>Factual Principal</u> (47c) To whom little is forgiven, the same loves little. In other words, Forgiven much, Love much! (Why do you think she was <u>Weeping</u> and <u>Washing</u> and <u>Wiping</u> and <u>Kissing! = DEVOTION</u>) How do you categorize your sin? BIG or LITTLE?
 - **4.** He told her that He Forgave Her in Front of All (48) Jesus does for us when we acknowledge and accept Him into our hearts! Before the angels and before the Father in Heaven! (Matt 10:32)
- P/A Jesus KNOWS that we are SINNERS who <u>fall short of the glory of God</u> (Rom 3:23) but <u>waits for us to</u>
 ACKNOWLEDGE and <u>CONFESS our SIN</u> before Him (tt. 1 John 1:5-9) The unbroken Pharisee <u>couldn't SAY it!</u>
- **C. Defining Forgiveness (49-50)** Luke then focuses on *'the comments'* of <u>the other dinner guests,</u> who *"began to SAY to themselves,"* just as Simon the Pharisee did! *Notice that...*
 - 1. Jesus' Action is Questioned Again (49) The majority of people will always question Who Jesus is and What Jesus is doing. That's ok... Reasoning in our hearts is GOOD, if it is SEARCHING for TRUTH! He KNEW their hearts also but focused on the much needed ASSURANCE that this woman needed..
 - **2.** Jesus Clarifies what Saves a Person (50a) "Your FAITH has saved you." He also said this directly to the woman. Jesus' WORD brought healing power to her broker spirit. Not only forgiven but SAVED!
 - **(Eph 2:8-10)** for by grace you have been saved through faith and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, ⁹not of works, lest anyone should boast. ¹⁰For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.

- 3. She then went in PEACE! (50b) Everyone desires PEACE but there is only One Way to find it! -
 - (Rom 5:1) Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

CONCLUDING THOUGHTS: Jesus is faithful in DEALING WITH SINNERS! — He is also faithful to FORGIVE ALL SINNERS who come to Him, who recognize their BROKENESS before Him! Is that you?...
