## FAMILY PLANNING PT. 2 | GENESIS 17:9-27 | PASTOR MARK BOFILL | 8/13/2023

I. Fleshly Plans (16:1-6) | II. Escape Plan (16:7-16) | III. Master Plan (17:1-27)

**INTRO:** Continuing from last week... Having Right Plans and Planning rightly is important!

- I. FLESHLY PLANS (16:1-6) Sarai and Abram...The danger of Birthing Ishmaels!
- II. ESCAPE PLANS (16:7-16) For Hagar and Ishmael. Submission to God's plan brings blessings.
- **III.** <u>MASTER PLANS</u> (17:1-27) God's Sovereign plans for Abraham and His descendants: God **REVEALED** His Name (1-3): *God Almighty!* Abraham was to <u>Walk Blamelessly before God!</u> God then **RENAMED** Abram and Sarai, ensuring that <u>His promises are sure!</u> God then **REAFFIRMED** the <u>Land Covenant</u> (7-8).
  - **D.** God <u>REQUIRES</u> (9-14) <u>CIRCUMCISION</u>, which is the <u>surgical removal of a male's</u> foreskin. God mandated this for Abraham and all of the males in his household as a <u>religious representation of the covenant God made with him</u> (Gen 17:9–14; Acts 7:8).
    - 1. This Sign was to signify that they were different than others, i.e., distinct because they depended on God to fulfill the promise, not themselves! Unfortunately, it became mere ritual, to those whose hearts did not belong to God. In (Deut 10:16), God rebuked the Hebrews, "...circumcise the foreskin of your heart, and be stiff-necked no longer."
    - 2. This sign was meant to be within their flesh (13) Later, God would desire to put a New Spirit within them (Ezek 11:19-20), that they would be His people, walk in His ways. As with NT believers, we should cut-away the callous flesh from our hearts so that we can be sensitive to the things of the Spirt!
    - Given that *the Eighth day* is when <u>a baby's immune system is at its strongest</u> for such an operation, it seems likely that <u>God directed</u> that children be circumcised on this day.
    - <u>Circumcision doesn't get us any closer to God</u>: For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision avails anything, but faith working through love (Gal 5:6).
    - W. Barclay said, "If a man is to be in special relationship with God, something far more is needed than a mark in his body. He must have a certain kind of mind and heart and character." Real circumcision is devotion of Heart and Mind and Life to God!
- P/A <u>Christians are to walk in obedience to God's Commands</u>. We should "<u>Cut Away</u>" anything that <u>desensitizes you</u> to the promises that we have in Christ Jesus, (2 Cor 1:20) says, For all the promises of God in Him are Yes, and in Him Amen, to the glory of God through us.
  - E. God REPORTS (15-22) "FOUR" SURE PROMISES for Abraham's Family Plan... ha!
    - **1.** His Wife SARAH would be Blessed (15-16) So far, all the blessings have been for Abraham and God's purposes for his descendants, <u>but now</u>... God reveals **His favor towards Sarah!** Not a fleshly plan, but a promised plan to **bear a son** from her own body. **NOTE:** Even though the fulfillment of what He promised **seemed impossible**, God would certainly do it! **He is God ALMIGHTY!**

- Abraham's Response (17-18) He fell on his face...not for worship, but in LAUGHTER! Not mocking laughter, but Ecstasy and Elation. (Picture the scene) Abraham laughed because he knew giving birth was impossible! He was Overjoyed, but still unclear what the Almighty was reporting... "Oh, that Ishmael might live..." Abraham found it hard to trust God for more than what he could conceive of (We are often no different!) But God quickly made it clear in (v.19) ... NO!
- 2. His Wife Sarah would bear <u>ISAAC</u> (19) The name ISAAC means "laughter," or "he <u>laughs</u>." This is interesting, because there are <u>three different occasions of laughter</u> associated with Isaac's birth: <u>Abraham laughed for joy</u> when he heard his wife would give birth to the promised son (Gen. 17:17); <u>Sarah laughed in unbelief</u> when she heard the news (18:9–15); and Sarah laughed for joy when the boy was born (21:6–7).
- The Covenant would be established with and continued through Isaac.
- 3. His Son <u>ISHMAEL</u> would also be Blessed (20) God knew that Abraham loved his son Ishmael, but he was not part of the Covenant! God therefore "heard" Abraham's Angst as He did Hagar's Hurting (v.11). God reported His Plan to bless and multiply him.
- (Gen 25:12-18) records the <u>12 princes of Ishmael</u>, who have multiplied exceedingly, even today... as promised by God! Islamic traditions consider Ishmael to be the ancestor of **Arab people Muslims** also believe that <u>MUHAMMAD</u> was the <u>descendant</u> of Ishmael that would establish a great nation, as promised by God in the OT.
- **4.** His Son <u>ISAAC</u> is the <u>SON OF PROMISE</u> (21-22) God emphatically declares the Covenant is with Isaac! (*Not Ishmael*). And *Isaac would be born of Sarah within a year!* Then God vanished from Abraham's presence. (*Talk about a <u>Prophetic Family Plan!</u> Whew*)
- **F.** Abraham's <u>RESPONSE</u> (23-27) Abraham immediately <u>OBEYED THE LORD</u> and circumcised all of the males. This took great faith because **he was 99 yeas old!** 
  - Take note that Ishmael was 13, right about the time when rebellion would arise in his life, as with many teens! But his rebellion would not be against his father Abraham, but against the "son of promise," his brother Isaac. Stay tuned... more to come!

<u>CLOSING THOUGHT</u>: This is God's Master Plan in the works. We can read it, but are we learning from it? God has a perfect plan and what He plans is the **best for us and our families** and the nations. But mankind has generally chosen to reject God and His plans. **DO YOU** TRUST GOD PLANS FOR YOUR LIFE?
