## **APPOINTMENT REMINDERS** | LUKE 10:1-24 | PASTOR MARK BOFILL | 12/7/2025

\*I. Appointed to Go (1-11) | II. Appointed to Judgment (12-16) | III. Appointed Blessings (17-24)

**INTRO:** As we move into Chapter 10, Jesus continues to spread the message of the Kingdom throughout the land. – Previously He sent the 12 apostles to minister in Galilee (9:1-11; Matt 10). – Now He would expand His outreach to include that land of Judea, Appointing Additional Disciples to prepare His way.\*

I. APPOINTED TO GO (1-11) – READ: Last week we ended Chapter 9 with Jesus challenging three would-be disciples to Count the Cost of Discipleship (Luke 9:57-62) – Now Jesus Appointed 70 others to GO!

- A. The Sending (1-3) "70 were Appointed" and SENT, into every city that He was about to go. In (Num 11:16, 25-26) we learn that Moses also commissions 70 elders as representatives. Elsewhere in scripture we find the number 70: Years of Captivity (Jer 25:11-12); Weeks of Daniel (Dan 9); Men of the Sanhedrin; and in (Gen 10) we find 70 as the number of nations (rep the whole world, which is the Target!). Now he sends them...
  - 1. Two By Two (1) (Eccl 4:9-12) tells us that two are better than one! Two witnesses is mentioned 10x's throughout scripture, but I want to highlight two: (2 Cor 13:1) "By the mouth of two or three witnesses every word shall be established." AND (Heb 10:28) "Anyone who has rejected Moses' law dies without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses." (Going out in Two's was essential!)
    - Notice also that Jesus, "Sent them before His face" NOT to "sow seeds," but to Bring in the Harvest! –
      Today especially, people are ripe for the picking... But the laborers are few!
  - 2. <u>The Prayer</u> (2) "His Harvest" Jesus considered the multitude of humanity to be like a harvest field ready for gathering. A massive field with only a few people working diligently. This is why He instructed the LABORERS to PRAY! Instead of praying for an easy job, they were to pray for more LABORERS... Not Spectators! We must be willing to go ourselves to do the work in the field! PRAY!
  - P/A If we believe that Jesus is coming back soon, then we should respond to Jesus' GREAT Commission!
  - **3.** <u>The Caution</u> (3) <u>"Lambs amongst wolves"</u> Jesus informed them that <u>there would be opposition</u> from people, which is often <u>influenced by unbelievers</u>, so be cautious! When you start praying to bring in the harvest, Satan begins laying traps for you. We too must know that <u>"Any disciple who takes Jesus Christ seriously becomes a target of the devil!"</u>
  - P/A He's not sending us out with <u>a shotgun</u> or <u>high-powered rifle</u>! When Appointed to Go, we GO as are lambs, <u>walking in humility</u> (Matt 10:16) Going as lambs among wolves <u>doesn't sound very attractive</u>; yet it was exactly how Jesus was sent, and <u>how the power of God worked</u> through Him mightily.
- **B. The Instructions for Homes (4-7)** Here, Jesus provides specific instructions for their journey...
  - 1. Re: <u>Provisions</u> (4a) "Money bag, knapsack, nor extra sandals" Go as you are, without supplies! (Trust!)
  - 2. Re: <u>Path</u> (4b) "Greet NO ONE!" Jesus' mission was of great urgency, so they must stay focused! Sharing a meal in those days would often include <u>prolonged delays</u>. (Don't become distracted on your mission!)
  - 3. Re: <u>Peace</u> (5-6) "Let your peace rest on it" Their presence brought <u>Peace and Blessings</u> into a home! If a disciple <u>was welcomed in a hou</u>se, it was because a "son of peace" is lived there. If they were rejected, their peace would not rest on the house. This teaches us a good principle for life...
    - Have you ever visited a home where you feel not welcomed? When you encounter this, LEAVE because you are not welcome there! And when you leave, take your peace with you!

- **4.** Re: <u>Premises</u> (7) <u>"remain in one house, receiving their provisions"</u> In order to make a greater impact, the disciples were to <u>set-up a Home Base</u> so they could effectively reach a whole city. Moving around often would be a waste of time. Also, they were to <u>be Content with the Provisions offered</u> by others as they ministered. This <u>Principle</u> is often **Abused** or simple **Excused**... (Expound) But it is **Biblical**...
  - (1 Cor 9:14) Even so the Lord has commanded that those who preach the gospel should live from the gospel.
  - (1 Tim 5:18), "You shall not muzzle an ox while it treads out the grain," and "The laborer is worthy of his wages"
- C. The Instructions for Cities (8-11) Jesus also gives His disciples specifics as they evangelized the city...
  - **1.** Re: <u>Reception</u> (8-9) <u>If they <u>were received</u></u> ... they could <u>eat</u> in that town, <u>which lead to ministry</u>: <u>Healing</u> and the <u>Proclamation</u>, that ... "The Kingdom was Near!" (Learn to discern when people are receptive)
  - 2. Re: Rejection (10-11) If <u>rejected</u>... the disciples were to; 1) Abandon that city to its own fate! 2) "Wipe the cities dust from their sandals," which indicated that would have <u>no part with them</u>, 3) They were to make clear that, "The Kingdom of God was near!" (But they were obviously not worthy of it!)
- P/A These Ambassadors were <u>Appointed to GO</u> and proclaim the 1<sup>st</sup> coming of the Lord. They were to pick through each city and **Bring in the Harvest** that was ripe for gathering.
  - Likewise, If we are disciples of Christ then we are also called to be Ambassadors for Christ! (2 Cor 5:20) Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God.
  - We **ARE CALLED** to **PROCLAIM**, "The **RETURN** of the Lord," which is near! So then, we too should sense the urgency of the times. I like what Wiersbe said, "whether we are in the harvest field, on the highway, or in the home, our highest privileged and our greatest joy is to do the Will of God." (Is this your will?)
- II. APPOINTED TO JUDGMENT (12-16) READ: In this section Jesus speaks <u>Warning and Judgment</u> to <u>those who REJECT the message of the Gospel</u>. Jesus <u>specifically mentions</u> <u>three Ancient Cities</u> that were <u>previously judged by God: <u>SODOM</u> (v.12; Gen 19), <u>TYRE</u> (v.13; Ezek 26-28), and <u>SIDON</u> (v.14; Isa 23).</u>
- A. The Warning (12) Jesus makes clear that "the city" (10-11), who rejects their message, would receive a Future Judgment ... one even More Severe than the Judgment inflicted on SODOM! (Fire & Brimstone)
- **B. The Woes (13-15)** Jesus then lists <u>Three PARTICULAR Cities of Galilee</u>, which was also determined for judgment.
  - Chorazin and Bethsaida (13-14) These two cities were privileged to witness <u>all the miracles that</u> took place in their town by Jesus and his disciples; referred to as... Mighty works!
    - So, He pronounced a WOE upon them! The word "Woe" indicates judgment, "One" for each city.
    - I find it interesting that Chorazin means "a furnace of smoke," Bethsaida means "house of fish." –
       When you combine the two cities on Judgment day, you get Smoked-Fish! (Ha)
    - He compares these cities to TYRE and SIDON, who "would have" repented in their day (long ago).
       He even lists the potential extent of their repentant act: "Sackcloth and Ashes."
    - Jesus then makes clear that TYRE and SIDON will face a lesser judgment than these cities! WOE!
  - 2. Capernaum (15) The city was exalted <u>because of Jesus' presence</u>... He made His headquarters there! But <u>it too would be judged</u>, BROUGHT DOWN to HADES, because the majority of the town did not believe!

- 3. The Standard Jesus uses is an Accountability to the Light Received! (John 3:20) declares, "For everyone practicing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed." (Condemnation)
- **4.** The Same Standard is still in effect today! Sadly... MANY cities, states and even countries have REJECTED the Light of the Gospel!
  - A simple search on the internet revealed that Providence, Rhode Island frequently <u>appears as the least</u>
     "Bible-minded" city in studies by the <u>American Bible Society</u>. According to <u>ranker.com</u>, <u>coming in Second</u>
     is: Albany/Schenectady/Troy, NY. And <u>Third is</u> Boston, MA and Manchester, NH. Followed by San
     Francisco/Oakland/San Jose, California & Las Vegas, Nevada: <u>These are often included in lists of less</u>
     religiously-inclined urban centers. (https://www.ranker.com/list/most-godless-cities-in-america/robert-wabash)
  - Furthermore, China, North Korea, and Vietnam are officially ATHEIST States where <u>religion is</u>
     <u>suppressed or controlled!</u> So many governments have Rejected the Light of the Gospel! And if they don't repent, woes are coming!

C. The Warrant (16) – Jesus concludes His instruction to the 70, with the Reality of their Reception or their Rejection by some. – If the cities to which they travel "Hears and Receives" their preaching of the Gospel, then they are receiving both the Son and the Father. – But if the cities "Reject the Messengers", then they rejecting Jesus and the Father! – Wow... Jesus places their representation on the same level with the SON AND THE FATHER! (they should remember that they were His representatives and not take it personally!)

P/A – The more one hears God's truth, the more we are accountable to it! – And those who Reject it are APPOINTED TO JUDGMENT! (cf. Heb 10: 26-31)

**III. APPOINTED BLESSINGS (17-24)** – In this third section <u>Luke reveals Several Blessings</u> that stem from their mission: **READ (17-20)** – *The duration of the mission is not known...* it could have been several weeks, but *the 70 returned with <u>Great Joy!</u>* – Spurgeon points out, "Not one of the lambs had been eaten by the wolves."

A. Report of the Disciples (17) – The disciples told Jesus of their encounters with demons, which yielded to them... in Jesus' Name! – The word subject (Grk. "hupotasso"), a military word to "line up under" authority. – It's possible that they were especially overjoyed because in (v.9), Jesus only told the seventy "what to do," He did not give them the authority to cast out devils like He did with the twelve disciples in (9:1-2).

- B. Refocus of Jesus (18-20) Their report prompted Three Re-actions from Jesus:
  - 1. He <u>Recalls</u> the Fall of Satan (18) Jesus associates the casting out of demons <u>that they experienced</u>, to "a time" when He saw Satan fall <u>like</u> lightning. There are many interpretations to Jesus' statement...
    - Many assume that this speaks of Satan's first fall, from <u>a glorified state</u> to <u>a profaned state</u>, as a result of his PRIDE (cf. Isa 14:12-14; Ezek 28:12-15; <u>1 Tim 3:6</u>) But according to (Job 1:12, 1 Kings 22:21, and Zech 3:1), <u>Satan still has access to heaven!</u>
    - Others say it refers to Satan's fall in the future, when he is cast out of heaven (Rev 12:9)
    - But here, the Fall "<u>like lightning</u>" from heaven doesn't mean that Jesus is describing either reference. Context suggests that He is describing Satan's Fall as dramatic and sudden, as a bolt of lightning from heaven. What then is Jesus saying?
    - Most likely: <u>It refers best</u> to <u>the defeat</u> of Satan by Jesus in the wilderness, (Luke 4:1-12). (He overcame him)
    - Thus, the disciples' victory over evil spirits WAS PROOF that Satan had lost his position of control and strength and was now in a lesser position. (Later, Jesus completely disarms all demonic forces Col 2:15)

- 2. He Reinforces Their Authority (19) Jesus then gives Authority to them over all the power of the enemy! This authority also allows US to trample on the enemy as he seeks to war against the saints (cf. Mark 16:17)
- 3. He <u>Redirects</u> their Focus (20) He tells them *not to rejoice* <u>in their power over demons</u>, but to <u>rejoice</u> <u>because their NAMES are written in heaven!</u> Re: *Names*, the verb indicates they "<u>have been written</u>," and they STAND written... <u>in heaven!</u> (Phil 4:3; Rev 2:17,13:8) *lit*. *Inscribed!* (Isa 49:16)
- C. Rejoicing of Jesus (21-22) READ: Jesus then offers Joyful thanksgiving to the Father (21a) Notice here that the Son rejoiced in the Spirit with gratitude towards God. (i.e., thrilled with joy in the Holy Spirit, exulted!)
  - **1.** At the Father's Revelation (21b) He praises God for revealing the kingdom to the "babes" (the disciples) and NOT to the wise and learned (Jewish teachers); giving them the privilege of seeing and hearing what many Prophets and Kings desired to see and hear. (God's ways amazing!)
    - The greatest realization to focus on is the **Reality of Salvation!** That He would save a wretch like me! Don't rejoice on what you're doing in the ministry... **Rather rejoice in what He's done for us!**
  - 2. At the Father's Relationship with the Son (22) Jesus declares that HIS <u>Appointed Blessing</u> was Authority! "All things have been <u>delivered to me by My Father</u>" (22a). The apostle John also clarifies this, adding the <u>MOTIVE</u> for such delegation: (John 3:35) "The Father <u>LOVES the Son</u> and has given all things into His hand."
    - Another <u>Appointed Blessing</u> is found in <u>His Intimate Relationship with the Father</u>, "no one knows who the Son is except the Father, and who the Father is except the Son..." (cf. John 10:30)
    - And a Third <u>Appointed Blessing</u> is found as Jesus spoke of HOW <u>God allows US to have some part in their special relationship</u> "...and the one to whom the Son wills to reveal Him." In (John 17:21) Jesus Prayed to His Father..."that they [believers] all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me." (John 17:21)
- **D. Recognized Blessings (23-24) READ:** Jesus' privately makes His disciples <u>aware</u> of yet another **Appointed Blessing!** "Blessed are the eyes which see the things you see."
  - These Ambassadors were <u>privileged</u> because <u>they saw and heard things!</u> <u>They beheld Jesus, watched Him with their eyes, they Heard Him with their ears (cf. 1 John 1:1)</u> They got to witness <u>the fulfillment</u> of so many prophesies firsthand! (Heb 1:1-3; John 1:1,14; Phil 2:5-11)
  - The Ancient Prophets & Kings had their own privileges in their days, but they all would have loved to see Jesus do the things He did! Hebrews tells us that many of the Old Testament Saints died, holding onto those promises! (Heb 11:39)

**P/A** – We too, must <u>recognize</u> that <u>Additional Blessings</u> are near <u>to those who love Him</u> and WAIT for His appearing (2 Tim 4:8; Heb 9:27) – In (Luke 21:28) Jesus said... "Now when these things begin to happen, <u>look up</u> and lift up your heads, because your <u>redemption</u> draws near."

CLOSING THOUGHTS: These APPOINTMENT REMINDERS are important for us to consider because our current time has its own challenges and privileges. –So, We do the work because He has CALLED US – We do the work because His Harvest is truly great. – We do the work because the laborers are few. – We do the work because our Lord's return is eminent!

God has Appointed Us to exist in this time, so that we can warn others!
