Intro: In our two previous sessions on Se	rvant Leadership, we covered the Heart of a Servant
Leader and the Head of a Servant Leade	r. We learned that it all starts in the Heart (Rom 10:10)
"For with the heart one believes unto rigi	hteousness" but it must also manifest in the Head,
(Rom 12:2) "Being transformed in the <u>r</u>	renewing of our minds." – When the emotional and
the <u>mental</u> are in sync, it should lead to _	i.e., use of THE HANDS
OF A SERVANT LEADER.	

- HANDS: We use them in nearly everything we do! We use them to <u>text on our phones</u> and to <u>wash dishes</u>...we use them <u>tie our shoes</u> and even <u>clap to show appreciation</u>. They are special!

- WHAT DO HANDS IN CHRISTIANITY?

- Raising Hands to the Lord is a sign of reverence, honor, submission. (worship)
- Laying on of Hands is a symbolic transfer of power from a righteous person for the purpose of healing or blessing.
- Clean Hands represents <u>innocence</u>, as opposed to "blood on hands" representing guilt of a crime or murder, abuse of power (cf. Isa 1:15). (Have you looked at your hands lately?)
- God Created Our Hands to <u>DO THINGS</u> and <u>WORK to ADVANCE HIS KINGDOM</u>! God apparently thinks hands are so important that the word: **HAND** appears 1,466 times in the <u>Bible</u>, and the plural word: **HANDS** appears 462 times.

The Hands of a Servant Leader (then)...

— When we are born again, our lives change... we enter into serving our Lord as we follow His great example. — The word MINISTRY is from the Greek word diakoneo, meaning "to serve" or douleuo, meaning "to serve as a slave." In the NT, ministry is seen as service to God and to other people in His name. Jesus provided the PATTERN for Christian Ministry...

- Remember, "Jesus came TO SERVE, not to be served..." (Mark 10:45), and He laid down His life (If He is the Pattern, then we ought to follow it! John 15: 13, Greater love has no one than...)
- Jesus also He taught His disciples the importance of practically serving one another as demonstrated in (tt. John 13:1-17; 14), when He washed their feet! "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ______ one another's feet."
- As believers, we should learn to use our ______ to serve the Lord and others! (I.e., be willing and available to USE your hands in the Body of Christ)
- A. <u>Scripture has Much to Say</u> about using our HANDS to <u>Glorify God</u> and <u>Bless others</u>.
 - **1.** The Apostle Paul plainly states, "...that you may WALK worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being _____ I in every good WORK and increasing in the knowledge of God" (Col 1:10)

especially in (Acts 6:1-7), when the early church began to multiply, Growing Pains came along with it. – When a conflict arose about food distribution, they were wise enough to seek out Seven men of Good Reputation, Filled with the Holy Spirit and Wisdom to serve over the matter of daily distribution. • HANDS were needed to SERVE _____, which MINISTERED to Others! (Still Needed!) B. Scripture Clarifies that are not the only ones to be involved in Ministry: "And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, 12 for the equipping of the saints for the ______ of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ..." (Eph 4:11-12) – The Body does the work! HANDS are to be up in Ministry, to bring health and growth to the body! • From the early NT churches to the churches of our day, every Christian should be "in the ministry" of helping others, because the Holy Spirit has provided Gifts for service – (tt. Rom 12:3-8) For I say through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith. ⁴ For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, ⁵ so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. ⁶ Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us ______: if prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith; ⁷ or **ministry**, **LET US USE IT in our ministering**; he who teaches, in teaching; 8 he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness. (Are you exercising your gifts? - When you do...it Blesses others!) The Hands of a Servant Leader... A guick examination of Jesus' Hands in the Bible shows us II. ARE FOR how to bless others. As a carpenter Jesus had rough hands, in ministry He had caring hands... • At Bethsaida Jesus spat in a blind man's eyes and used His hands to restore his evesight. • To the man with Leprosy, Jesus reached out and restored his flesh. • At Capernaum he blessed and broke the bread which fed thousands! • Jesus also used **His hands to rescue** a drowning Peter. Jesus **surrendered His Hands** to die for the sin of the world! We may think we have nothing to give, but WE ALL HAVE SOMETHING TO

— Our Hands can be like Jesus's hands when we die to self! Only then can we meet... Physical needs (clothing food, shelter), Financial needs (through tithing and supporting ministries), and of course Spiritual

needs (Sharing the Gospel).

2. In their Public Ministry, the Disciples went on to <u>Learn</u>, <u>Practice</u> and even <u>Teach</u> PRACTICAL SERVANTHOOD those who were committed to "the way." – We see this

- In (tt. Rom 12:10-13) Paul's tells us How to meet Practical Needs – ^{10a} Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love Our AFFECTION, ^{10b} in honor giving preference to one another; ¹¹ not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit Our APPLICATION, rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation Our ATTITUDE – ^{12b} continuing steadfastly in prayer; ¹³ distributing to the needs of the saints, given to hospitality. – Our APPROACH
How do you use your hands to do His will? Here are a few ideas that don't require you to go
far from home or your home church:
Serve as an usher or greeter
Get involved in an area of service or ministry (Outreach) Many hands make light work!
Volunteer for Sunday school or other youth ministries Participate in a Rible Study.
 Participate in a Bible Study Use your hands to help with the Church Building/Grounds/Cleaning
Help in a local mission project
 Share your faith with someone you know that does not know Jesus
someone to come to church with you
 Deliver a meal to someone in need or assist a single mother with a home project
The Hands of a Servant Leader Work for God: And whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men, 24 knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance; for you serve the Lord Christ. (Col 3:23-24) The Hands of a Servant Leader are to be: This is a faithful saying, and these things I want you to affirm constantly, that those who have believed in God should be careful to maintain good works. These things are good and profitable to men. (Titus 3:8)
The Hands of a Servant Leader are to: Therefore, my beloved brethren, be
steadfast, immovable, <u>always abounding in the work of the Lord</u> , knowing that your labor is
not in vain in the Lord. (1 Cor 15:58) (Say it in your mind "I Serve the most High God!)
The Hands of a Servant Leader will be: For <u>God is not unjust to forget</u>
<u>your work</u> and labor of love which you have shown toward His name, in that <u>you have</u>
ministered to the saints, and do minister (Heb 6:10)
