HOSANNA: "Save Now!" Mark 11:1-11 | PASTOR MARK BOFILL | 4/02/2023

I. The Setting (1-8) | II. The Saying (9-10) | III. The Significance (Topical)

INTRO: It is quite evident that <u>since the Fall of Adam</u> that **mankind needed a Savior!** In our fallen state <u>we have drifted so far from God</u>. Longing for satisfaction and fulfillment in life, **we end up empty!** – Apart from God, <u>all of us end up in bondage</u> to someone or something, which leaves us <u>yearning for deliverance</u>! **This is why God had to send His Son... Jesus Christ!**

- The very name "Jesus" communicates that <u>He will SAVE PEOPLE from their sins</u>! (Matt 1:21)

- The Salvation/Deliverance needed first and foremost, is from Eternal Death (John 3:16-17).

– GOD'S SALVATION PLAN involved the 'right timing and circumstances' to manifest: (Gal 4:3-5) says, Even so we were like children; we were slaves to the basic spiritual principles of this world. ⁴ But when the right time came, God sent his Son, born of a woman, subject to the law. ⁵ God sent him to buy freedom for us who were slaves to the law, so that He could adopt us as his very own children. (Gal 4:3-5 NLT) – God knew What to do, When to do it, and Who to send to Save His People! JESUS IS THAT SAVIOR!

When we examine the Gospel accounts of <u>Jesus' Triumphal Entry</u>, we learn of the <u>special</u> <u>circumstances that existed</u>, where God's People were looking for a deliverer. (*tt.Mark* 11:1-11)

I. THE SETTING (1-8) – It was the Feast of PASSOVER! For a very long time Israel had been Waiting for a King (*Expecting Him*) – The events of this narrative <u>take place</u> on Sunday, (*aka Palm Sunday*) only a few days before Jesus would be crucified (cf. John. 12:1,12). – From Jericho, Jesus made His accent to Jerusalem, with many followers, having CALLED: <u>Two Blind Men</u> (Matt 20:29-34), <u>Blind Bartimaeus</u> (Mark 10:46-52), and a <u>Short Tax Collector</u>: <u>Zacchaeus</u> (Luke 19:1-10); whom He said "...the son of man has come to seek and to save that which was *lost*." (Luke 19:10).

A. Jesus' Needed A Donkey (1-3) For what reason? May I suggest for the same reason that he needed a Boat to preach (Luke 5:3-6), and Loaves and Fishes to feed the crowd (Matt 14:16-18), and a Coin to make a point (Matt 22:19). – Jesus needs Disciples to spread His love!

• Jesus sent two (unnamed) disciples towards a town called Bethphage (house of unripe figs) on the western slope of Olivet to get a donkey to use for His entrance into the holy city.

• <u>Kings and Soldiers rode horses and stallions</u> in the ancient world... <u>Not Donkeys!</u> – Yet, Jesus was demonstrating that <u>He was the King of Peacemaking</u> by riding the *foal of a colt*. Many *Israeli patriots* anticipated Him to arrive as <u>a powerful warrior</u> or an <u>elevated</u> <u>political monarch</u>, but he would not.

Jesus also needed this young donkey specifically to fulfill the prophecy of (Zech 9:9).
B. Jesus' Instruction Carried Out (4-8) – This is what all of Jesus disciples should do! Follow
His Instructions (vv. 4-6). – He said, "Go" and they went, amen... He said, "find the colt," and they found it were He said, amen... He said, "loose it, and bring it," and they did, amen... He

said, *"If you are questioned," provide the reason,* and <u>they did</u>, amen! – As disciples, <u>we must</u> <u>remember that Jesus is Omniscient</u>! (*He has a reason for everything*!) When He instructs us to do something, **Trust and Obey Him as your LORD!**

• *The DISCIPLES spread their clothes* (7) – Out of respect for their Lord, the disciples laid their clothes on the "<u>two donkeys.</u>" (Matt 21:7), i.e. the donkey and the colt; of which "no one had ever sat" (John 12:14).

MANY spread their clothes/leafy branches (8) – This was <u>a very special moment</u> in which the <u>excitement intensified</u> as Jesus road into Jerusalem on a colt. (*Picture the scene!*) – Their actions were part of an 'ancient practice' when welcoming a new king; <u>as with Jehu</u>, (2 Kings 9:12-13). – I see two interesting insights here:

1. CLOTHES, in the Bible, <u>typifies our righteousness</u> (e.g., <u>Defiled garments</u>, <u>Linen Garments</u>, or being <u>Stripped of Garments</u>, etc.) Here, garments are "Laid down" before Jesus

2. Waving PALM BRANCHES was a sign of accepting their new king, but also a sign of defiance against the Roman government. – Patriotic Jews, who desired the restoration of Israel's former glory, waved these branches. (Like Political parties of our day, we wave our flags/banners) These were looking for a POLITICAL KING, not a Savior! Just like today, people desire salvation of a different kind!

Before Jesus could take care of the political problems of His people, He had to take care of the sin problem!

CLOSING THOUGHT: Though Jesus often concealed Himself from public recognition, **He now intentionally declares Himself to be the nation's Messiah and King**, in fulfillment of Old Testament prophesy. – Matthew included in his gospel, that <u>the King coming on the foal of a</u> <u>donkey</u> was an Exact Fulfillment of (Zech 9:9), "*Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem!* <u>See, your king comes to you</u>, *righteous and having salvation*, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." – Everything was now in place for Jesus to make His Triumphal Entry.

II. THE SAYING (9-10) – The words uttered here are **Words for a King** (Exalting Him). The <u>crowds that went before</u> Him <u>and that followed Him</u> were shouting '*Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!*

A. *HOSANNA* is the Hebrew expression meaning: *"Save Now! or Save us, we beseech thee,"* taken from (Psalm 118:25). The phrase is used in three of the Gospel accounts: (Matt 21:9; Mark 11:9, 10; John 12:13). – The context of (Psalm 118), is a <u>declaration of confidence</u> in the Lord's salvation, made in a time of need!

B. As Jesus came <u>through the city gates</u> of Jerusalem, they <u>made references to David and</u>
<u>David's kingdom</u>, because for a long time the <u>Jews had been waiting for the Davidic</u>
<u>Covenant to be fulfilled</u> (2 Sam 7; 1 Chron 17:11–14; 2 Chron 6:16). – Their CRY, "Hosanna in

the Highest" (God be praised) showed that their expectation in their Messiah had finally arrived to establish God's kingdom there and then (cf. Luke 19:11). (Comes in the name the Lord)

C. "Blessed is He" (Matt 21:9) – This is an exact quotation from (Psalm 118:26), along with the messianic title, "Son of David." The crowd acknowledged this as a Messianic claim! – Interestingly enough, the date was Sunday, [9 Nisan, ad. 30} ... Exactly 483 years after the decree of Artaxerxes mentioned in (Daniel 9:24-26).

- Why was the word HOSANNA so appropriate? Because it was a CRY OF HOPE from an oppressed people living under Roman Oppression! Their cry was 'Save us now!'
- Just a week later Jesus would save them, but not in the way they would have imagined.

CLOSING THOUGHT: These words are words of **affirmation** and **adoration**. Words suitable only for a King (Exalting Him). <u>Many recognized and praised Jesus genuinely</u> for who He was... **MESSIAH**...amen! But <u>other motives existed too</u>! [GOD KNOWS THE MOTIVES OF OUR WORDS]

III.THE SIGNIFICANCE (*Var.***)** – <u>What Jesus faced during Passion week</u> **must have been exhausting** <u>physically</u>, <u>emotionally</u>, and <u>spiritually</u>! **But** <u>His works</u> were the works of a King (Execution His Father's Will) – As Jesus marched into Jerusalem that week, **He rode in as the antitype of the Passover lamb.** He was the sacrificial Lamb of **(Gen 22:8)**, which *God promised to provide for Himself!*

HOW DID HE APPROACH IT ALL? Jesus Christ was *intensely focused* on the mission that His Father prearranged, so that mankind could be reconciled to the Father. DILIGENTLY...

A. Executed With PASSION – The Triumphal Entry was <u>so significant</u> that it was recorded in all four of the Synoptic Gospels: (Matt 21-27; Mark 11-15; Luke 19-23; John 12-19). <u>Several significant events took place:</u>

- Triumphal entry on Palm Sunday (Zech 9:9)
- Jesus cleansed the temple for the second time (Luke 19:45-46)
- Jesus disputed with the Pharisees about His authority (Mark 11:27-33)
- He gave his Olivet discourse (Mat 24-25)
- He Ate His last supper with His Disciples (Luke 22:7-38)
- He Prayed at the Garden of Gethsemane, where He was betrayed and arrested.
- He was unjustly tried! (Luke 22:54-25)
- He was scourged and sentenced to carry a Roman cross to Golgotha
- He was crucified on the day before the sabbath, where he was buried in the tomb.
- on Sunday, the day after the Sabbath, He was gloriously resurrected.

No wonder His sweat was like drops of blood while praying in the Garden! (Lk 22:44) So, when Jesus rode into Jerusalem, **He knew that His time was soon** in *which He must die for the Sin of the World*. He was the only offering that God could accept. (*Our Propitiation!*)

B. Executed for our DELIVERANCE! – Scripture tells us that the **Messiah would come** <u>to</u> <u>set the captives free</u>! (Isa 61:1-3) *"The Spirit of the Lord God is upon Me, because*

the Lord has anointed Me to..." – This is what He desires to do for **all mankind**, but you <u>must</u> <u>first believe in Him</u>. *But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that His is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him* (Heb 11:6)

- Salvation is first and foremost deliverance from Eternal Death (John 3:16-17).
- But we also need to be delivered from:
 - Uncleanness: (Ezek 36:29) Things that defile us ...Oh Lord, SAVE NOW!
 - Sin: (1 John 3:5) Things that separate us ...Oh Lord, SAVE NOW!
 - Our Enemies: (Luke 1:71,74) Those who oppress us ... Oh Lord, SAVE NOW!
 - This Present Evil World: (Gal 1:4) Which <u>seduce</u> us ...Oh Lord, SAVE NOW!
 - The Devil (Col 2:15; Heb 2:14-15) Who seeks to detroy us ...Oh Lord, SAVE NOW!
 - God's Wrath (Rom 5:9; 1 Thess 1:10) Which is not meant for us ... Oh Lord, SAVE NOW!
 - Ourselves (Jer 17:9; Rom 7:24) As we often deceive us ... Oh Lord, SAVE NOW!

CLOSING THOUGHT: The significance of Jesus triumphal entry was that HE KNEW the desperate circumstances of mankind since the fall, and **He did something about it! He laid down His life Willingly and Passionately...for ALL!**

- What is your expectation of Jesus?
- Has your "Hosanna" grown into constant "Hallelujahs?"
- Are you as passionate about God's kingdom as Jesus was?
