- 2. God ensures that His faithful servants are remembered. The bride of Christ must be faithful.
- 3. God <u>demands</u> (and deserves) all the <u>credit</u>. Joseph is not the story here, God is the story. He is the provider of all. Whether wisdom, riches, or abundance, that is ONLY provided by God.
- 4. God will make us <u>fruitful</u> in the land of our <u>affliction</u>. God ultimately placed Joseph in a position of power and <u>blessed</u> him.
- 5. God knows what He is doing.
- 6. The humble servant of God does not exalt themself.
