The first Sunday of September we were at the Centre Biblique d'Anglet. (See the visual that Pastor Rosner made up on the right) Alain gave the morning sermon and then a conference on "The Gates of Jerusalem" that afternoon. They know Alain's songs by heart and included some in the time of worship. It was good to see some old friends. However, we were hoping to see Angel, one of the church members who had moved away from Pau six months ago. He didn't make it that day, but says he plans to attend sometime soon. We pray that he doesn't stray from the Lord and that he finds Christians to encourage him in his walk.

This church in Anglet had provided those New Testaments in Basque that I've asked you to pray for recently. They have just edited the "Good Seed" in Basque, 365 short meditations intended for those who have not yet discovered salvation. Of course, I had to take some! One has already been given to the professor of Modern History at the University of Pau and another to the secretary of the Protestant Archives in Pau who was enthusiastic about giving it to her good friend... the retired curator of the Basque museum!



Sunday, September 25th, we enjoyed hearing the testimony of Marianne and seeing her baptized. She was thrilled to testify before her four children, their husbands and children, as well as her sister and other members of the family. In reality, she did more explaining of what baptism means than talking about herself. In all, she did a good job.

Alain's sister wanted to come. Since her car was in the shop and her internet was down, she went to the train station the day before to buy train tickets so we could pick her up in Tarbes and take her with us to Pau. But then Camille came down with intestinal problems caused by her cancer treatments. Martine thought she could reasonably get away Sunday morning anyway because the nurse would be there, but she couldn't wait until the only train that Sunday afternoon could take her home. Well, the church is reorganizing so that Alain can be free to do other things... so he decided to offer to drive her home right after the service. What we had planned for the potluck went along with us to her house. In the end, everything turned out okay. Alain even had an exceptional opportunity to witness to her husband. Camille was actually able to talk and to spend some time with us before excusing herself to go lay down. Her mother went to see her a few minutes later and said she was in tears to have to leave us: "They are just so nice!" But she was just too tired. We continue to pray for her understanding and acceptance of God's message!
