In fact, it wasn't intended for evangelization, so the invitations with the Israeli flag didn't draw problems. The church of Brignoles had just invited sister evangelical churches. After the meeting, several asked if he could come back and present the subject in their church...



At the Christmas program last Sunday the children's play took the title: "A Christmas Tree Unlike Any Other" portraying a family who is unhappy because the last Christmas tree had been sold. So they prayed and during the night the son had the idea of putting one together with leftover branches. The family was so hap-

py, they thanked the Lord for this answer to prayer...but then the father said something like...why make such a big deal over a Christmas tree? Which is more important: this tree or the one

The Significance of the Vine

1. The Usage of the Vine in the OT

- a. Vines represented Israel. Hosea 10:1, Psalm 80:8, Isaiah 5:1-8
- b. Choice vines are symbolic of how God created Israel—a wild vine signifies rebellion and produces wild gourds. **2 Kings 4:40**
- c. Vine and fig trees together represent promised blessings of God. Malachi 3:1
- d. Sitting under your own vine and fig tree refers to times of peace and tranquility. See **Micah 4:4, 1 Kings 4:25, Zechariah 3:10**
- e. A withered vine represents God's judgment. Joel 1:12
- f. A vine yielding its fruit represents hope. Zechariah 8:12
- g. Enemies of Israel are called the "vine of Sodom." Deuteronomy 32:32
- h. Proverbs used vineyards to describe both lazy people and an excellent wife.

Proverbs 24:30-31, Proverbs 31:16

i. Jonah even had a vine that grew over him. See Jonah 4:6-10

2. The Usage of the Vine in the NT

- a. The laborers in the vineyard. Matthew 20:1-16
- b. The two sons. Matthew 21:28-32
- c. The tenants. Matthew 21:33-41, Mark 12:1-9, Luke 20:9-16
- d. The barren fig tree. Luke 13:6-9
- e. Jesus uses the fruit of the vine to illustrate the coming kingdom.

- 1. A <u>withered</u> vine represents God's judgment (**Joel 1:12**) and a vine yielding fruit represents <u>hope</u>. **Zechariah 8:12**
- 2. The vine is <u>pruned</u>, <u>prepared</u>, and <u>preserved</u> for the next season of growth and fruit production.
- 3. Jesus is emphasizing the <u>redemptive power</u> and <u>purification</u> that comes through the teaching and work of Christ.
- 4. Jesus is commanding His disciples to abide in Him.
- 5. Apart from Jesus, we can do <u>nothing</u>. Jesus <u>sustains</u> us while the Father <u>prunes</u> us.
- 6. To abide in Christ is to maintain a <u>close</u>, <u>continuous</u>, and <u>reliant</u> relationship with Jesus.
- 7. Those who abide in Christ and have the Word(s) of Christ dwell within them are promised <u>communion</u> and <u>provision</u> from Christ.
- 8. Those who bear much fruit <u>prove</u> to be disciples of Christ, and thus <u>glorify</u> the Father.
- 9. We receive Fatherly tenderness through The Vine.
- 10. By obedience to Christ's Commands, we abide in His love.
- 11. True joy (or joy made full) is found in living a life that is <u>aligned</u> with Jesus' teachings and in maintaining a <u>close</u> relationship with Him.
- 12. Whether you're in a season of loss, new growth, or producing fruit, <u>abide</u> in Christ and <u>rely</u> upon Him.
