E-mail from our Global Partners in France Alain and Carol Larrey

Dear Friends,

The testimonies at the March 10th baptismal service were tearjerkers. To start with, we heard the experience of a couple who recently fled their country. An Arabic-speaking lady has welcomed and been translating for them since their arrival, but it's evident that they had already discovered salvation and learned much by reading the Bible all on their own. The husband told how he had been brought up Muslim, but something bothered him. He had been taught that God had "tricked" everyone by substituting someone else on the cross to make believe Jesus had been raised from the dead. He wondered why God would do that. On a business trip in Asia he got to talking with someone who talked with him about what the Bible says. Although he argued hard and defended his religion, he went home troubled. He continued his Muslim life, respecting traditions. However, after marrying, he started questioning things out loud to his wife. She was furious! She phoned her family: "He's not Muslim! He's a Christian!" They said he was the devil and encouraged her to divorce. She put him out of the house. However, she eventually accepted him back, and they decided to read the Bible together. Their eyes opened; they understood salvation through Christ's sacrifice and became true believers. Next, the husband was put on trial. He thought he could count on "friends in high places" and considerable amounts of money, but nothing did it. "I bawled like a baby, and pleaded God for help." The Lord brought him through; he miraculously got away just one day before his death penalty was declared. Arriving here, he wanted to take a stand by being baptized. His wife too. During her testimony, her determination enthusiastically showed through. At one point she didn't stop to let the lady translate!

Lydia, 18, was born in an Islamic country as well. When she was five, her parents became Christians which meant being marginalized when not outright persecuted for something that she hadn't chosen nor understood. School was especially difficult, worse for her brothers, even though they complied with traditions, like fasting during Ramadan. She felt lonely and rejected. More so when her father abandoned the family. She started crying out to God; He was always there for her. At 15 she wanted to make publicly known her own decision for Christ, and asked to be baptized. The church refused saying she was too young. Again she felt rejected. She turned away from the church, but not from God. Two years later He allowed her to come study at the university in Pau. Wasn't long before she discovered our church: "I met Christians who have become like family!" Tears came to her eyes...the Lord had answered her prayers for friends and acceptance. She was so thrilled to testify of her faith in Christ and be baptized!

Anna was born into a Catholic family in Portugal. Very early, her parents moved to Switzerland, and left her behind. She felt abandoned and unloved. Being passed between grandparents, she didn't understand why her family was so different from other families. Then the grandmother she was living with committed suicide! Anna started seeking God; He came near and comforted her. A few years passed and she fell sick to the extent of depending on a wheelchair. Again, she sought God's face; He was there for her. Anna arrived in Pau a few years ago, and, just like Lydia, discovered the church, good Christian friends and the acceptance that she'd been missing all her life. Recently her physical ailment has made a turn for the better. Her wheelchair goes unused in the back of the church. For her baptism, she carefully walked up onto the stage and went down into the water all by herself! Praise the Lord!

Prayers requests in short:

- The couple: for their safety, that they be granted permanent residency, for their spiritual growth and knowledge of the Word, adaptation to life in France, language study, change of career, etc.! Their names are kept confidential for the moment, but God will know who you are praying for!
- ♦ For Anna and Lydia: to be strengthened in the Lord, for their futures...
- ♦ For the youth group who will be in charge of the entire service next Sunday...for Easter!
- ♦ Saturday, April 6th, the youth group is sponsoring an evangelistic meeting with Lionel Nguimbi (a high-school philosophy teacher with a research master's degree in philosophy from Paris Nanterre University). They say it will be an "interactive conference" on the theme: Can we still believe in God's existence?
- ♦ April 12-14th: Alain will be the special speaker for a church weekend retreat organized by a church in Marseille.
- ♦ For Alain's new album that should be put on the internet in May.
- ♦ For Alain's evangelistic concert at the church of Pau, June 1st.
