

## **MESSAGE TO CONVERSATION GUIDE**

Week 4 | Greater Than Your Loneliness

- 1. We kicked off this message by talking about the classic game *if you were stuck on a deserted island & could only bring 1 thing, what would you bring?* What's the 1st thing you thought of?
- 2. Refer back to question #1. Do you find it strange that almost no one answers that they'd like to bring another person? Why do you think that is & how long do you think you could be on an island by yourself before you felt lonely?
- 3. In this message, we talked about loneliness. Joel said, *it's possible to have friends, co-workers, & even be in a basement church with a 100 people & still experience loneliness.* Why do you think this is?
- 4. Read Psalm 139:1-4. David is actually glad that God knows *"everything about me"*. David had a pretty colorful past (like most of us) & yet He's glad God knows everything about him because that means God's always with him. Why is that a better perspective than being afraid that God knows everything about you?
- 5. Joel said, *the reason God knows everything about you is because He's always present with you.* How can that impact your loneliness?
- 6. Read Psalm 139:5-7. Pick out a few phrases or words in this passage that encourage you & share them with the group.
- 7. Joel said, *the quality of your life is directly tied to the quality of your relationships*. Do you believe this to be true & if so, how have you experienced this in your life?
- 8. In Genesis, Adam is in paradise with God before sin entered the equation and God had been saying everything He created was *good* but what did he say about Adam being alone? What does this say about the cliche that *God is all we need*?
- 9. Often when we're lonely, we wait for someone to reach out to us. In this message, we learned that loneliness is our cue to reach out. What's 1 way you can reach out this week to deepen or add to the quality of your relationships?
