Exodus 2:1-10

1 Now a man of the tribe of Levi married a Levite woman, 2 and she became pregnant and gave birth to a son. When she saw that he was a fine child, she hid him for three months. 3 But when she could hide him no longer, she got a papyrus basket for him and coated it with tar and pitch. Then she placed the child in it and put it among the reeds along the bank of the Nile. 4 His sister stood at a distance to see what would happen to him.

5 Then Pharaoh's daughter went down to the Nile to bathe, and her attendants were walking along the riverbank. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her female slave to get it. 6 She opened it and saw the baby. He was crying, and she felt sorry for him. "This is one of the Hebrew babies," she said. 7 Then his sister asked Pharaoh's daughter, "Shall I go and get one of the Hebrew women to nurse the baby for you?"

8 "Yes, go," she answered. So the girl went and got the baby's mother. 9 Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Take this baby and nurse him for me, and I will pay you." So the woman took the baby and nursed him. 10 When the child grew older, she took him to Pharaoh's daughter and he became her son. She named him Moses, saying, "I drew him out of the water." NIV

I. Sometimes You Get Something Different Than What You Pray For

Exodus 1:15-16

15 The king of Egypt said to the Hebrew midwives, whose names were Shiphrah and Puah, 16 "When you are helping the Hebrew women during childbirth on the delivery stool, **if you see that the baby is a boy, kill him; but if it is a girl, let her live."** NIV

Exodus 1:22

22 Then Pharaoh gave this order to all his people: "Every Hebrew boy that is born you must throw into the Nile, but let every girl live." NIV

Matthew 2:16

16 When Herod realized that he had been outwitted by the Magi, **he was furious, and he gave orders to kill all the boys in Bethlehem** and its vicinity who were two years old and under, in accordance with the time he had learned from the Magi. NIV

Deuteronomy 18:15

15 The LORD your God will raise up for you **a prophet like me** from among you, from your fellow Israelites. You must listen to him. NIV

Ex. 6:20

20 **Amram** married his father's sister **Jochebed**, who bore him Aaron and Moses. Amram lived 137 years. NIV

Micro prayers = about me

Macro prayers = about God's divine purpose

Acts 7:20

20 "At that time Moses was born, **and he was no ordinary child.** For three months he was cared for by his family. NIV

Hebrews 11:23

23 By faith Moses' parents hid him for three months after he was born, because they saw **he was no ordinary child**, and they were not afraid of the king's edict. NIV

Entirely on their own, 4 they urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service to the Lord's people. 5 And they exceeded our expectations: **They gave themselves first of all to the Lord, and then by the will of God also to us**. 6 So we urged Titus, just as he had earlier made a beginning, to bring also to completion this act of grace on your part. 7 But since you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in the love we have kindled in you —see that you also excel in this grace of giving. NIV

Romans 12:1-2

1 Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, **in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.** 2 Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will. NIV
