MESSAGE TO CONVERSATION GUIDE

Rom Com | Crazy Lil' Thing Called Love

- 1. What's your favorite genre of movie (i.e. action, comedy, drama, sci-fi, rom-com, etc.)?
- 2. In this new series, we're talking about how to bring the *comedy* back into our *romance* (Rom-Com). What are some crazy things that love causes people to do at the start of a relationship? How does this line up with Proverbs 30:18-19?
- 3. Love always starts with *attraction*. Beyond physical appearance, what are some things that attract people to each other?
- 4. Read Song of Songs 1:2-4. This passage is likely King Solomon and his wife reflecting back on an early marriage memory. Why do you think passages such as this are in the Bible?
- 5. Read Genesis 2:23. We often isolate *attraction* to be only physically only. But when Adam sees Eve, he says "bone of my bone, flesh of my flesh". Bone is symbolic of inside beauty. Flesh is symbolic of outside beauty. So he could be saying, from the inside to the outside, I find you beautiful. Why is that so important in relationships?
- 6. Discuss this quote from the message, attraction is what 1st brings you together but character is what keeps you together.
- 7. Solomon's bride makes an unusual comment about her husband in Song of Songs 1:3. She says, *no wonder all the young woman love you!* What she most likely means is, *your character is so good, even my friends know you're a catch.* With that in mind, why is it important to get the perspective of the people we love on the people we are involved in?
- 8. The action step in this message was the same for single & married people, to be somebody who loves Jesus and has 'rizz' (charisma). How can that help you no matter what your romantic situation is or isn't?
- 9. Joel ended this message by saying, *you don't have to have a significant other to be significant.* Where does our significance come from and why is that perspective so important?
- 10. What's your 1 takeaway from this message and/or discussion?
