# MESSAGE TO CONVERSATION GUIDE

A Play Like No Other

1. What is your favorite thing about the Super Bowl? The game? The commercials? The food? The fact that football season is finally over?
2. In this message, we talked about communion. Is communion something your familiar or unfamiliar with? What sort of memories or meaning does communion bring out in you?
3. Read Jesus' words in John 16:33b. What's the bad news & good news in this verse? In what way has Jesus *overcome the world*?
4. Read Luke 22:17-20. In this message, we spent a lot of time focusing on Jesus' words to take communion *in remembrance of me*. What sort of things should we reflect on while taking communion?
5. In this message, we looked at 6 things to *remember* during communion. We started with, *during communion, remember Jesus' WORDS*. Read Matthew 5:43-44; 7:3... how would remembering & applying just those words from Jesus, impact the world? Do you have a favorite thing that Jesus said?
6. During communion, we want to *remember Jesus' LIFE*. It was Jesus' life that elevated the value of woman & children in a culture that didn't value them. It was Jesus' life that inspired the 1st hospitals, schools, & orphanages. How has Jesus' life directly made your life better?
7. In this message, we specifically didn't refer to communion as *The Last Supper*. Read Luke 22:17-18 in which Jesus points to a day in the future where we'll all be together in heaven, around a table & we'll take communion again with Him. What do you think that'll be like?
8. Joel ended this message by giving some *toasts* that some people from our church might say to Jesus at that table & what He's done in their life. What would you say?
