

Adulging

I. Introduction-

- Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity! Ps 133:1

Adulging= noun, the practice of behaving in a way characteristic of a responsible adult, especially the accomplishment of mundane but necessary tasks.

"it feels really good to take a step back from adulging and have someone else cook dinner for me"

A. The reason to prepare for our death

- Just as it is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment, 28 so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him. Heb 9:27
- For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account. Phil 1:21

B. Children with aging parents also enter into a new phase of life-

- Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 2 "Honor your father and mother" (this is the first commandment with a promise), 3 "that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land. Eph 6:1
- Command these things as well, so that they may be without reproach. 8 But if anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for members of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever. II Tim 5:7

II. Are we and our families spiritually ready to depart this life?

- Jesus told his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. 26 For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Mat 16:24
 - My relationship with Jesus Christ will define all my other relationships-

A. The path to eternal life with God-

1. There is only one way, one path to eternal life in heaven-

- Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. Jn 14:6

2. Only Jesus' death can pay for and remove my sins-

- This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. 12 And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved. Act 4:11
- He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. I Pet 2:24
- You were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, 19 but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. I Pet 1:18

B. There are only two destinations after we die-

- Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. 14 For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few. 15 "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. 16 You will recognize them by their fruits. Mat 7:13
- For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Rom 6:23

1. Well done-

- His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master. Mat 25:21

2. Depart from Me-

- "On that day many will say to me, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' 23 And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness. Mat 7:21

II. Are our relationships in the right place for us die-

- Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight. Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Rom 12:16

A. Parents responsibility is to raise adult children in the Lord, not older children-

- Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it. Prov 22:6
- Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord. Eph 6:4

B. The spiritual battle over the family-

- Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. 9 Resist him, firm in your faith. I Pet 5:8

C. The family's responsibility to Jesus Christ-

- Assuming that you have heard about him and were taught in him, as the truth is in Jesus, 22 to put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, 23 and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, 24 and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness. Eph 4:21

1. Do the essentials of Christian relationships-

Radically love and serve others

- Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. 4 Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. 5 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, Phil 2:3

Seek and grant and seek forgiveness to everyone-

- Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. 32 Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. Eph 4:31
- let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. 26 Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, 27 and give no opportunity to the devil. Eph 4:25

Continue to repent and grow in Christ and His character

- Speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ. Eph 4:14

2. To tell others about the good news of Jesus-

- You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth. Act 1:8

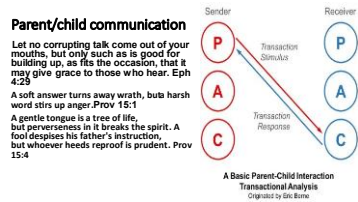
C. The hard part of supporting our parents-

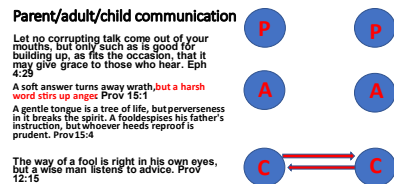
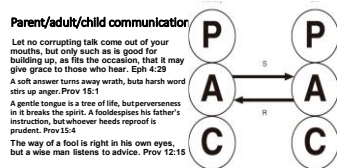
