

CHAPTER 10 | “How Do You Get Into Jesus’s Inner Circle?” GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

GOD STORY

- Have someone in your group share a God Story or testimony of how God has moved in their life.

INTRO QUESTIONS:

- What encouraged or challenged you from the sermon and/or the daily exercises?
- As a child, were you usually picked for teams first, middle, or last? How do you think that experience affected how you approach the world today?
- What are the benefits of being in the “inner circle” in an organization?

KEY PASSAGES:

- **1 Corinthians 12:13** - How revolutionary do you think this type of community was in the ancient world? How revolutionary would it be today?
- **Colossians 3:11** - What are some of the dividing lines people tend to put up in the Church? In the world?
- **Mark 3:31-30** - Who is among your inner circle of friends and family? Who would you struggle with welcoming into your inner circle?

GROUP DISCUSSION:

- Have you ever felt as if Jesus wouldn’t want to be around you? What changed?
- Have you ever had an experience at church that made you feel like you didn’t belong? What made you feel that way? How did you respond?
- In general, do you think Christians spend time with the same kind of people Jesus welcomed into His life? Why or why not?
- What was the last meaningful conversation you had with someone who isn’t a follower of Jesus?

WEEKLY APPLICATION:

- On page 64, we were challenged to ask a friend what it would take for them to feel welcome at church. Did anyone have this conversation and what did they say?
- Depending on when your group meets, you might not have reached the Hands section yet for your daily exercises in chapter 10. If that is the case, reflect back on the following question from last week’s Weekly Application.
 - On page 58, we were challenged to write a mission for our life. Who did this? Is anyone willing to share what they wrote?
